He has taught religion at Misericordia University for 29 years. During that time, he has published six books, including "The Secret Book of John Annotated and Explained."

He has appeared on the Discovery Channel's "Ancient Evidence" series and was featured in a one-hour documentary, "The Miracles of Jesus," that was produced by the BBC. National Geographic utilized his expertise for a documentary that delved into Jesus's medical techniques after Dr. Davies published, "Jesus the Healer: Possession, Trance, and the Origins of Christianity," in 1995.

The cable network, Arts & Entertainment, had him appear twice to discuss Jesus's disciples and offer insight into Satan as he is depicted in The

New Testament.
