W.H. Conyngham & Company has submitted a proposal for Hayfield Farms Phase II housing subdivision that would include 15 single home lots on Hayfield Road.

The proposal, according to Lehman Township Administrator Barbara Simms, will now be considered for approval. A decision will be made by the Planning Commission within the next few months.

"It will probably be a long time before there's anything

going on there," said William Conyngham of W.H. Conyngham & Company. "We're not in a rush."

Conyngham is unsure if any adjustments to sewers, traffic, etc. will need to be considered because he has not yet been given any directives by the township. He does not expect any additional lots to be added after Phase II is complete.

Hayfield Farms Phase I consists of 14 single home lots on Deer Park Road.

Locks of Love is a public non-profit organization that provides hairpieces to financially disadvantaged children under age 18 suffering from long-term medical hair loss.

Most of the children have lost their hair due to a medical condition called alopecia areata which has no known cause or cure.

Hair prostheses are created from donated hair like Cody's. These prostheses give the children a sense of self-confidence, restore self-esteem and normalcy, enabling them to face the world and their peers with confidence.
