ronto, Canada in October. In the paper, he analyzes William Gibson's science-fiction trilogy which includes the novels "Neuromancer," "Count Zero" and "Mona Lisa Overdrive." He argues that, even though the environments in the books are supposed to be dystopias, there are groups who resist it and there are utopian impulses.

Wright does research because he has a love for intellectual inquiry and also feels it is part of his job.

"Being a faculty member at a university is more than the time you spend in the classroom," Wright said. "If you didn't do anything outside of school, what would you have to offer?"

Wright obtained his Bachelor of Arts degree from Kenyon College in Ohio and a Master of Arts and Doctor of Philosophy degrees from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. Formerly of Chicago, he joined Misericordia University in 1988 as a professor in the history department. He did his graduate work on French history and specializes in it and has done research in cultural and intellectual history and cultural studies.




