## **Does LL** need new facility?

Does Lake-Lehman Junior/Senior High School need a new multi-purpose athletic facility?

That's what Lake-Lehman football head coach Carl Kern and **Football Booster Club President** Bill Holena want to know from parents, educators, students and the community.

In hopes of receiving public input on the matter, Kern and Holena are holding a meeting at 7 p.m. on Wednesday, Feb. 27, in the school's auditorium.

"We're trying to see if there is an interest in it," Holena said. "We know there is a need, but we are trying to see if people would help out to do it. It's mostly a funding issue."

The goal of the meeting is to have people come in to share opinions and ideas on a new athletic facility. If enough interest is sparked, more detailed plans and a proposal could be drawn up.

The proposal would involve constructing a new weight room, exercise room and possibly converting the current weight room into another locker room. The addition would be built onto the side of the school by the gym. Building the facility next to the football field instead of onto the school could cost double the money, Kern says.

Rather than ask the school board for money from the district's budget, Kern and Holena are eager to raise 100 percent of the money needed through fundraisers and donations. No official estimates have been attained for the cost of the building. One idea the two have for a fundraiser is to allow people to sponsor sections of the addition. Evervone who donates money toward a section would have their name on a plaque erected on the athletic facility. According to Kern, he has spoken in detail to Lake-Lehman Superintendent James McGovern about the facility and says McGovern is very interested in the idea. Kern says the equipment in the current weight room is outdated and can't accommodate everyone who wants to use it at the same time, forcing athletes to wait in line. A new athletic facility would benefit more than just student athletes since the weight room is also used as part of physical education classes for non-athlete students. An exercise room could benefit the entire school. Whether the public would support or undermine the proposal is yet to be determined, but Kern and Holena want to know either way and hope the meeting has a good turnout.
