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professional," said Suzanne Hillard, a nurse of 24 years and a member of the group.

When the group sets up its clinic in the villages, there is a greeting table, a blood pressure station, a place to see the doctor and a pharmacy area. Last year, each station had a Spanish/English translator. Each person treated received parasite medications and a piece of candy at the end of their visit.

Suzanne remembers one little boy came through and had his piece of candy. When he returned the next day with a family member, he refused a second piece of candy, indicating he wanted someone else to have it.

"The gratitude is amazing," Ron Hillard said, remembering

the same story.

The local group will take candy, gum, paper, pencils, soccer balls, baseballs, gloves and other things for the people of Nicaragua. The kids there love sports, but don't have any equipment. Some learn to throw by working in the sugar cane fields while others play with sticks and rocks. For this trip, the Scranton/Wilkes Barre Yankees donated balls and bats, Dick Miller donated baseballs and footballs and Mr. Z's Food Markets donated gift cards. At the end of the trip, the missionaries leave everything they've taken with them for the people. All the medications are to be used after they are gone and even their extra clothing is left for the people in Nicaragua to have.

"We can't eradicate the issues, but we can make a dent," Suzanne said.
