Another comedy by the creator of Rushmore and The Royal Tenenbaums, the film offers a quirky, melancholic take on family ties and father issues. Three estranged brothers, each embroiled in his own personal drama, take a train trip for a supposedly spiritual quest through India. Though trying to reconnect, they continue to argue and when two discover the real reason they were asked to take the trip, to visit their mother (Anjelica Huston), who is living in a Himalayan convent, they make plans to go home. After these plans go awry through a series of mishaps, the brothers are finally united after a tragedy
