GFWC Harveys Lake President Sue Lazur also congratulated each student and presented each with a certificate and a small gift.

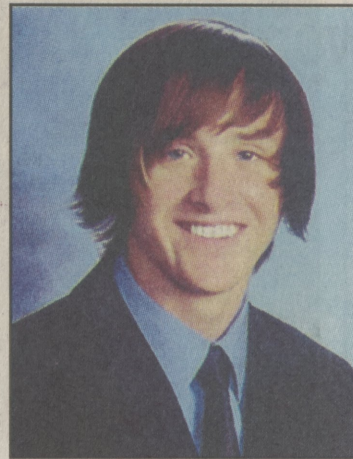
