During the summer between high school and college, Reich created a prototype for an airline, complete with route maps, flight schedules, logos, luggage tags and aircraft fleets.

After graduating from Dallas High School in 1998, he attended Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University in Daytona Beach, Florida.
