Dr. Camp receives grant

William D. Camp, Ph.D., of Dallas, professor of sociology and history at Luzerne County Community College, recently received a grant from the National Endowment to the Humanities (NEH) in Washington, D.C., to study at the Henry Ford Center in Dearborn, Michigan. Dr. Camp will take part along with several leading scholars and authors in the NEH Landmarks program "American Industry, Labor and Culture."



Through the program, he will explore artifacts and archival materials as well as participate in roundtable discussions. Dr. Camp received his B.A. from Gordon College, his M.A. from Fairleigh Dickinson University and his doctorate from Carnegie-Mellon University. A former Fulbright scholar to the Netherlands, he has participated in previous NEA programs at Brandeis, Harvard and Boston Universities.

Volodarsky receives award at symposium

He earned the opportunity to present at the symposium by receiving first place in physics and mathematics and first place overall in the Pennsylvania Junior Science and Humanities Symposium held earlier at the Pennsylvania State University in State College.

He received a scholarship to attend the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and was named an alternate representative to the International Youth Science Forum, to be held in July and August at London University, London, England.

Marshall to be included in academic registry

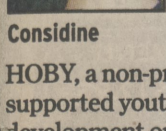
