

Roadside art on display

The Dallas branch of the Citizens Bank is currently exhibiting artworks by Shannon Rother of Dallas. The display is titled "Roadside Memorials."

"They remind me how fragile life is, how dangerous," Rother said. "I began the series a few months after my younger brother was in a horrible accident. The car he was driving was hit head on. My brother almost died. That's when I began to notice roadside memorials."

While Rother's family didn't need one for her brother, she wants to honor the lives of others through her watercolor paintings. The paintings are "full sheet" watercolors, large renderings of objects, textiles and memories left along the roadside to memorialize the loss of life.

Rother is a senior art educa-

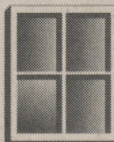
