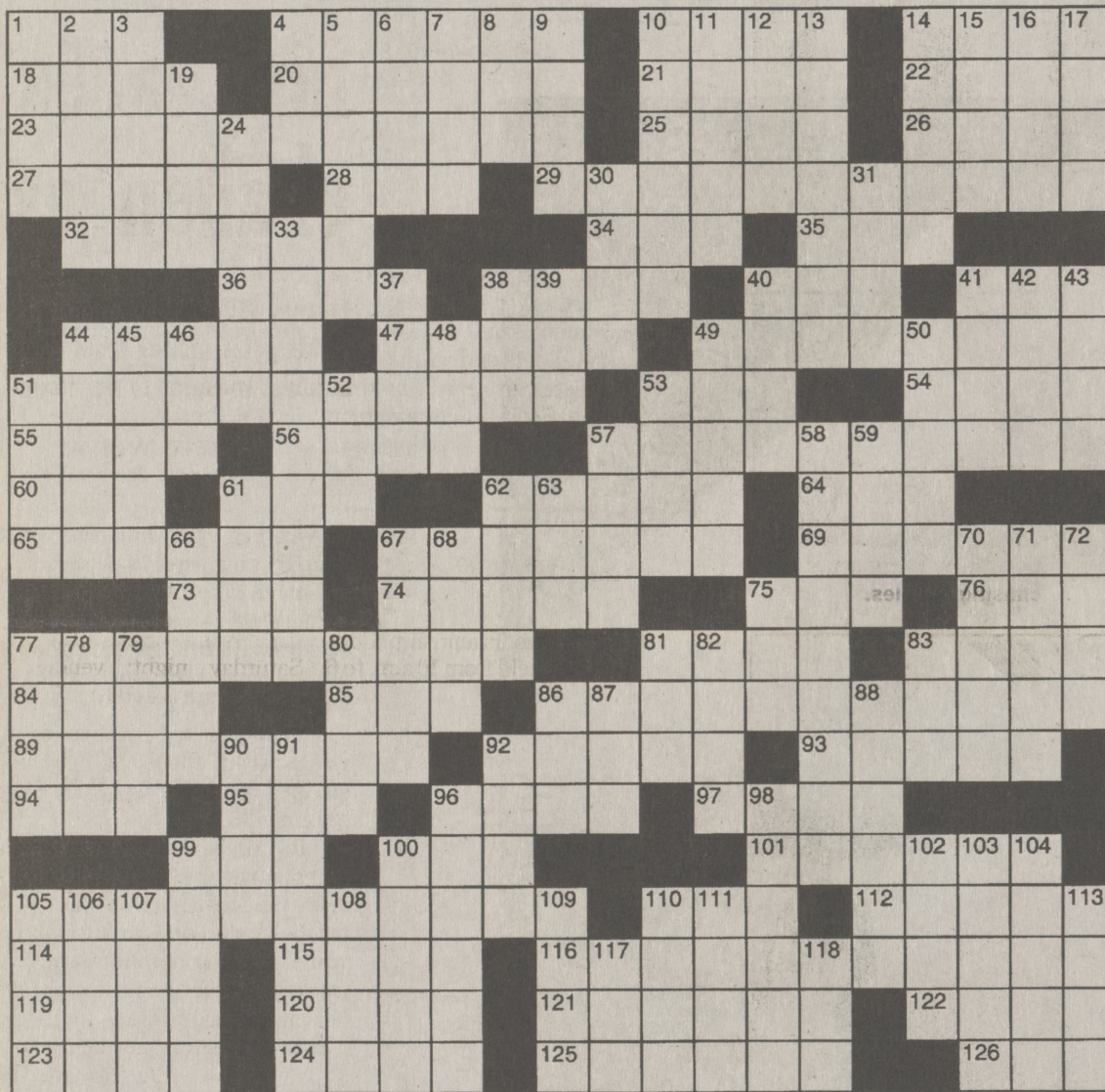

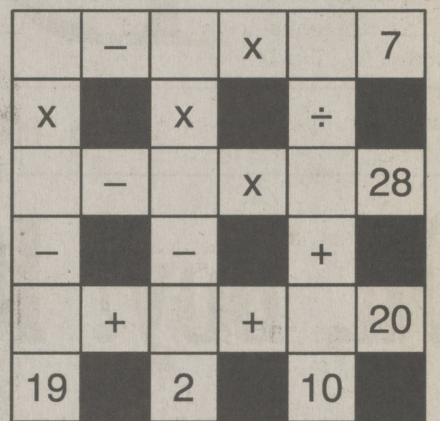

You can 'Meet Henry Ford' on October 5

The Lindhill Institute, located in Dallas, provides free historical programs to the public. It will hold a dramatization called "Meet Henry Ford" at 2 p.m. on Sunday, Oct. 5, at Perugino's Restaurant in Luzerne.

The institute was founded by former Luzerne County Community College faculty member Fred Walters and named for Charles Lindbergh and Walters' 1925 Shavertown home that is on a hill and serves as the meeting place for the institute.

The institute's all-volunteer group is composed of about six regular mem-

bers and 30 to 40 people who can be counted on to help as needed and who hail from a variety of professions but have limited or no theatrical training.

"Meet Henry Ford" is being held in honor of this year's 100th anniversary of the Model T Ford and the 80th anniversary of the Model A Ford. Hugh Taylor, 33, of Mountain Top, will play Henry Ford at the dramatization.

The program is open to the public but each person must have a ticket. Free tickets are available by contacting Walters at fwalter@epix.net or Lindhill Institute, P.O. Box 132, Dallas, PA 18612.
