Forum set for Misericordia

Misericordia will host the forum, "Choosing a President: Considering the Issues," at 1

p.m. on Tuesday, Sept. 30, in the McGowan Room of the library.

The forum features Woodrow Wilson Fellow Deborah Horan and Misericordia faculty members Brian F. Carso, Ph.D., a political historian and assistant professor of history and director of the pre-law program, and Cosima B. Wiese, Ph.D., associate professor of biology.

Horan will contribute her expertise on U.S. foreign policy in the Middle East, while Dr. Carso offers his expertise in the American political system and Dr. Wiese adds a science and technology perspective to the discussion with visiting high school students and the Misericordia community.

The forum is free to the public.

International reporter to deliver lecture

Woodrow Wilson Fellow Deborah Horan will deliver a public lecture at 7 p.m. on Wednesday, Oct. 1, in the McGowan Room of the Misericordia University library.

As a reporter, Horan has covered the Middle East from Morocco to Iran, meeting with ordinary people and leaders of political movements, including the Hezbollah in Lebanon and the Palestinian Hamas, and spent three weeks reporting on parliamentary elections from Tehran. In the lecture, she will discuss the benefits and challenges for a woman practicing journalism in the region.
