Principal McCarthy wore a shirt that said, "I'm a super

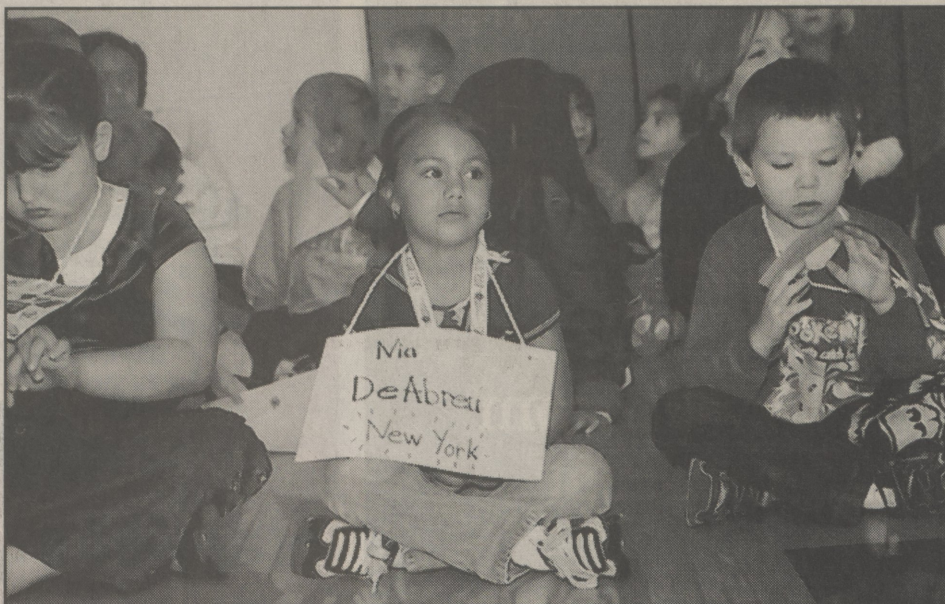
grandma" to show her love for her three grandchildren.
