Beginning at 7 a.m., there will be hot and cold beverages with donuts, coffee cake, sticky buns and a lunch/supper menu of sandwiches, soup, chili, hot dogs,

salad, wimpies and sweet treats. There will also be the special Lunch-to-Go/Supper-to-Go which offers a choice of a main item with chips, pickle, a sweet treat and a beverage, all freshly made and ready anytime after the café opens.
