# New book remembers train wreck

Fifty-eight years after the crash of the Pennsylvania Railroad train carrying the 109th Field Artillery Battalion on September 11, 1950, a new novel is telling the story of the historic train wreck and the soldiers killed that tragic morning.

Thirty-three local men died in the wreck near Coshocton, Ohio, when a famous westbound streamliner, the Spirit of St. Louis, running through stop signals, came out of a morning fog and slammed into the rear of the troop train.

The novel, "Smart Boys Swimming in the River Styx," by Robert Phillip Bomboy, a widely-published magazine writer and former Shavertown resident, meticulously reconstructs scenes in Wilkes-Barre, Kingston, Harvey's Lake and the Back Mountain during the years after World War II and follows the lives of five fictional characters and the women who loved them.


"The story of the 109th train wreck has haunted me all my life," Bomboy says. "I was nine years old, in the fourth grade, when the catastrophe happened, and several of the men who died were from my neighborhood. One of them lived on the next street and delivered our winter coal. I remember sitting perched on our front porch banister watching him send the pea coal down the chute into our basement. All the kids did that. We didn't have television then."

Thousands of people still remember the train wreck and honor the men who died and the 60 who were injured.

"I was one of the more than 100,000 men, women and children who lined Market Street watching the 33 weapons carriers bring the men home from the Lehigh Valley Railroad station, across the memorial bridge to the 109th Armory," Bomboy recalls. "Everyone was quiet. They had just left the valley the afternoon before. No one expected them to come home that way."

The novel follows the crack streamliner as it races west from Pittsburgh and, hour-after-hour, overtakes the two chugging steam engines pulling the troop train with 600 soldiers on board. The artillerymen were on their way to Camp Atterbury, Indiana, for training during the first months of the Korean War.

Readers have commented on how much of life at that time the book contains; several scenes are set at the popular beaches and amusement park at Harvey's Lake and at

Fernbrook Park in Shavertown. Shoppers jam buses and trackless trolleys on their way to Wilkes-Barre, buy mangoes and red beets at the open-air Grand Union market on Public Square, eat lunch in the crowded Betsy Ross restaurant, watch a matinee at the newly-refurbished Paramount Theater (now the Kirby Center) or stroll down South Main Street to see vaudeville at the Penn or Orpheum thea-

The novel celebrates that sweet youthful moment, exactly in the middle of the last century, that many look back upon as a time of innocence.

Reviewers have had high praise for the book. Says one: "A woman's love, a brother's hand, a father's faith, this is a novel that will make you remember how it was. It's a great read for those who grew up during that time, or for soldiers and their families at any time. And it's a fine story for those who are much younger."

The 109th Field Artillery train wreck stands as one of the worst in American railroad history. In the intervening 58 years, only five U.S. train wrecks have had more casualties. The new novel contains a memorial to the dead and injured.
