
#### **DHS MARCHING BAND** PERFORMS AT CITRUS BOWL

"This technology can pick up a problem before the dog can show you it's not functioning 100 percent," Walters said. "We want to get to the animal and help before symptoms show up.'

Two other techniques may be used in VOM. They are the cold laser technique, which heals at the cellular level, and myofascial treatment, which works into the muscular level to treat scar tissue or injury.


