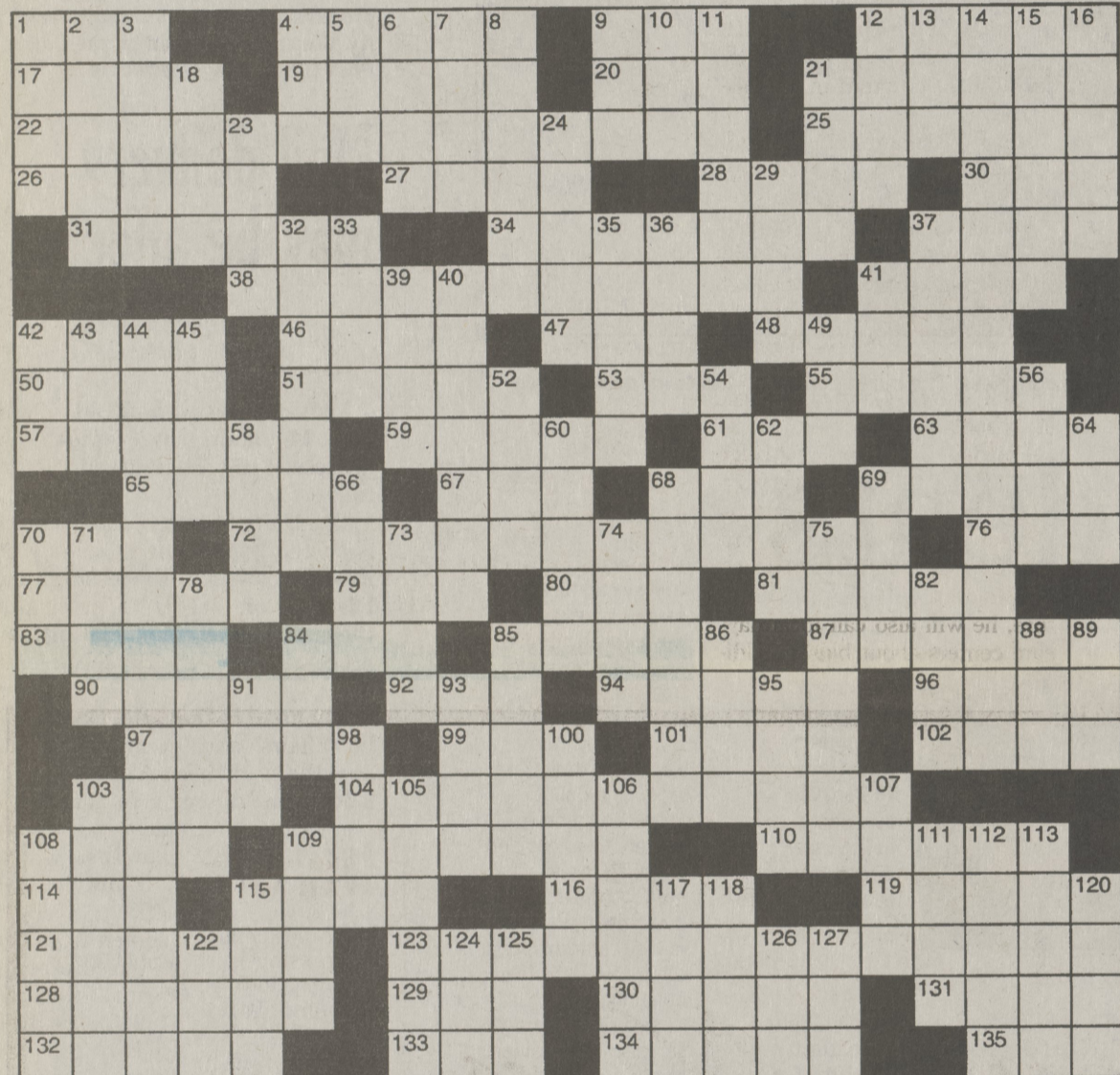

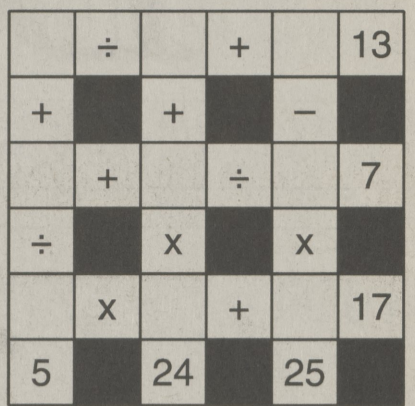

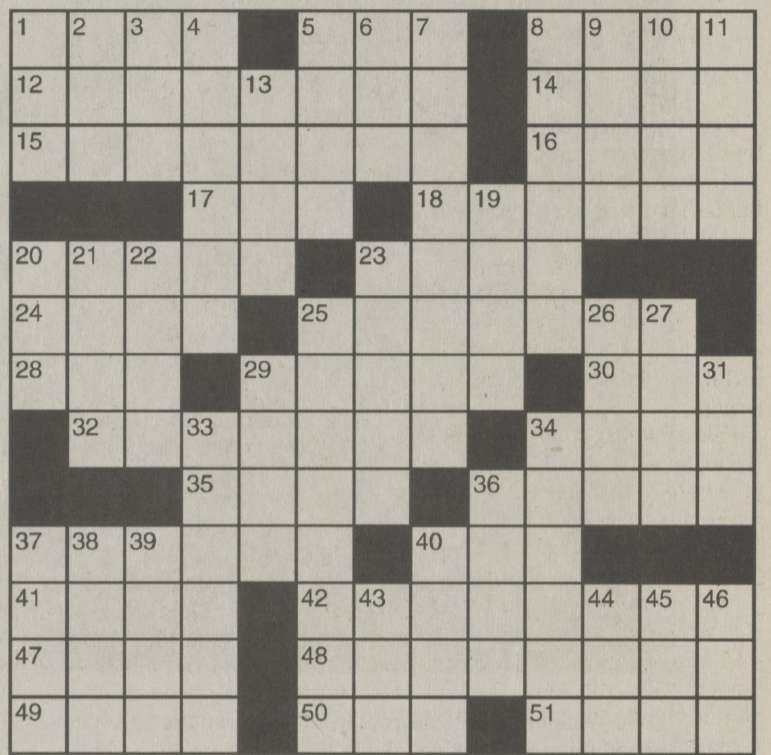

Officers of the Dallas American Legion Riders are Art Parks, president; Barbara Jacoby, secretary; Nathan Jacoby, sergeant-at-arms; and Bill Exorhopoulos, treasurer. The group meets at 7:30 p.m. on the third Friday of every month at the Post home on Route 415 in Dallas.

Sixteen men and women are now members of the Dallas American Legion Riders. About half of them belong to the Harveys Lake American Legion.

Membership requirements include owning a motorcycle and

being a member of any chapter of the American Legion, Sons of the American Legion or the American Legion Ladies Auxiliary. Immediate family members are included. There is a \$12 annual fee per member.

Melanie Parks and the couple's daughter, Tara Fenner, of Dallas, are also members of the Dallas American Legion Riders.

"We do not refer to or consider ourselves a motorcycle club," Parks said. "We're an extension of the Legion. We're just a group of people that likes to get together and ride. If we raise a few bucks for charity along the way, fine."

Parks says the Dallas Riders hope to do some fundraising events for charity in the future, in-

cluding a sponsored ride with other local American Legion Rider chapters, but no details have been set. Other local American Legion Rider chapters consist of Mountain Top, Freeland, Dickson City, Dushore and Montrose.

The Dallas chapter will not participate in Rolling Thunder, which Parks had planned to attend with his son two years ago.

"I'd like to see it continue to grow and be able to do more things," Parks said of the group. "We're kind of limited because of our funds, but that comes with time."

Anyone interested in joining the Dallas American Legion Riders is asked to attend an upcoming meeting.

cal mail delivery — you will have the same carrier and your time of delivery will not change," Daiutolo said. "The letters you mail locally for delivery in Wilkes-Barre will still be delivered overnight as they are now."

If the Wilkes-Barre mail processing plant should close, the Wilkes-Barre Post Office would remain open, Daiutolo says. About 200 people are employed at the processing plant. Potential job changes have not been decided.

"While it is possible that some positions will be transferred to the Scranton facility, it is also possible that through natural attrition, any affected jobs could be absorbed within local postal service facilities," Daiutolo said. "Any changes will be made in full compliance with the collective bargaining agreements with our employee unions."

Smith says he doesn't understand how closing the Wilkes-Barre processing facility will save the USPS money. He feels there are other ways the Postal Service can cut back without affecting the public.

One such way, Smith says, is

eliminating the postal service's employee relocation program. The program purchases employees' homes at their appraised values and resells them so employees can move for their job.

About 7,000 people have signed an online petition against stopping mail processing in Wilkes-Barre and Smith hopes that number will grow. The petition and other information pertaining to the potential processing consolidation are available at savethewbpo.org.

"We really want to get the public on our side and let them know their service will be reduced," Smith said.
