



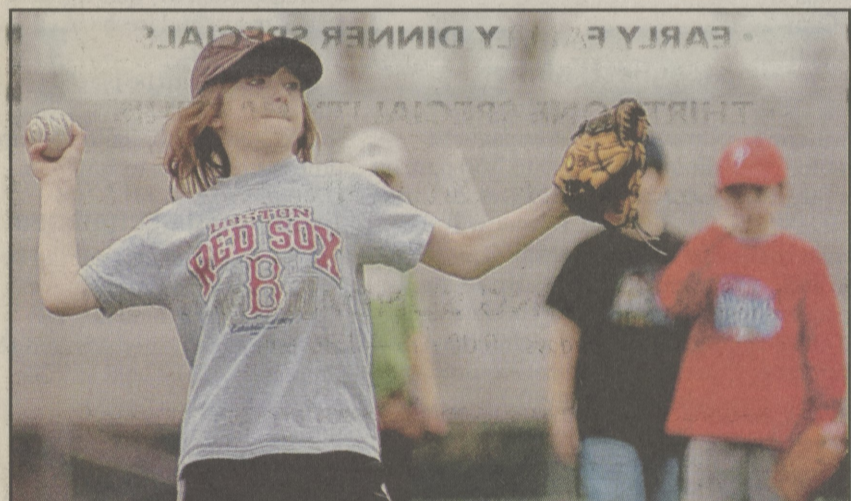

## Play ball!

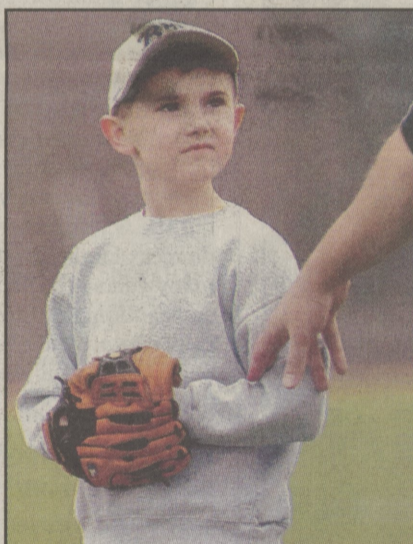
The Lake-Lehman baseball team held a baseball camp for Little League-aged children with all proceeds to benefit the Lake-Lehman Baseball Booster Club.

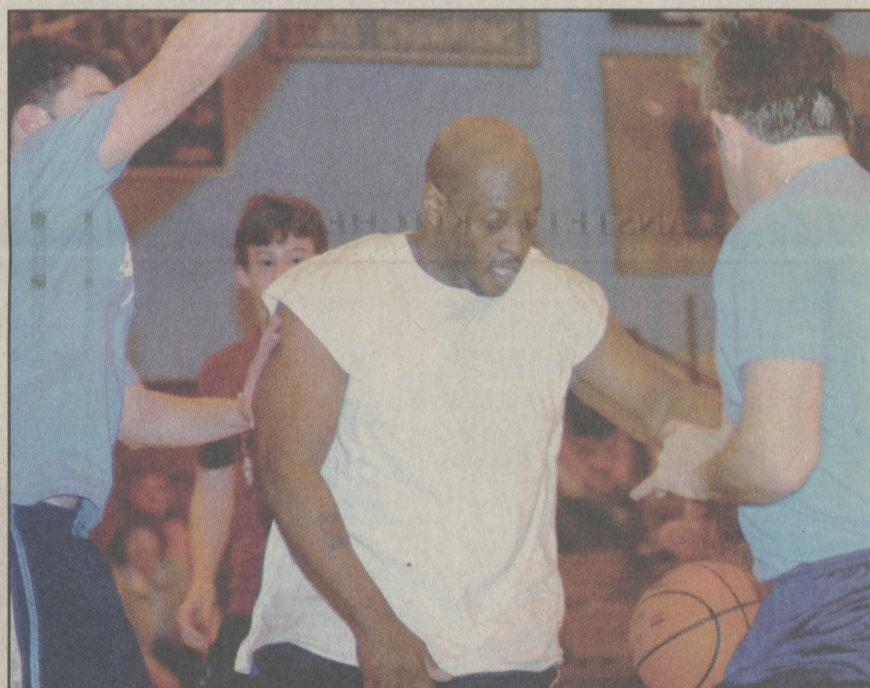

## Like father, like son at Dallas HS

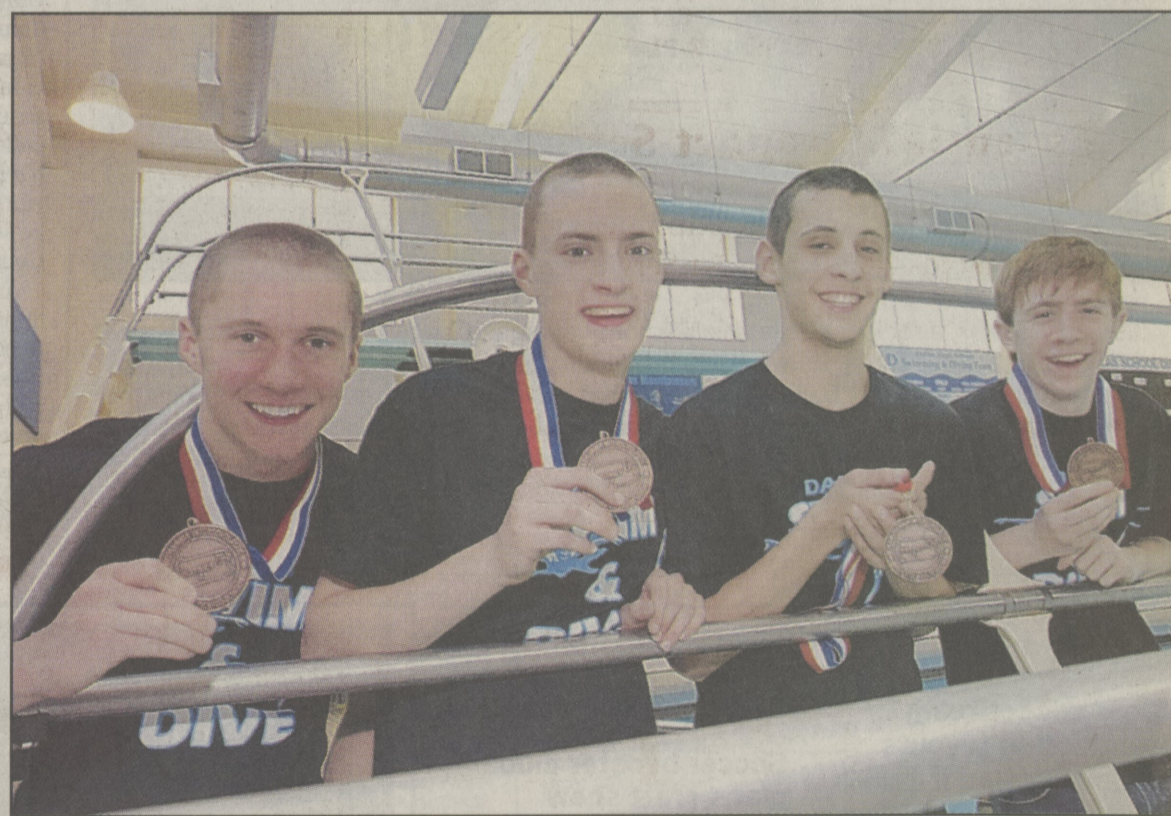

## Swimmers break 7-year record

Four Dallas High School swimmers have broken a seven-year-old school record for the 200 Medley Relay.

Juniors Dan Fasulka (backstroke) and Cody Sabesky (freestyle) and sophomores Brandon Harding (breaststroke) and Chris Taminini (butterfly) completed

the race on Feb. 27 at districts in 1:47.57 minutes, breaking a school record held since 2002.

Bob Murphy (deceased), Shane Shrader, Joe Stredny and Doug Yeager previously held the record with a time of 1:48.37 minutes.

The Dallas swim team is

coached by Romayne Mosier. "The boys were chasing down that record for the entire dual meet season, missing it by a narrow margin several times," Mosier said. "Their determination came full circle at districts, snagging a fourth-place medal and the school record."
