Sweeping starts; code enforced

Maintenance code being enforced

The Dallas Borough Codes Enforcement Office announces the seasonal enforcement of the Dallas Borough Property Maintenance Code.

Property owners should be alerted that inspections will be scheduled for all property owners deemed in violation of the code and the borough will prosecute all offenders through the enforcement of the regulations.

Recent routine property inspections in neighborhoods throughout the borough revealed numerous violations, including exterior property violations for property owners failing to maintain their premises in a clean, safe and sanitary condition. The borough will require property owners to remove all vehicles not properly registered and inspected, inoperable motor vehicles, failure to cut grass, appliances littering yards, debris and rubbish or other inappropriate materials littering yard areas.

Residents should note that the annual Dallas Borough Spring Cleanup will be held this year beginning Monday, May 4, and continuing through Saturday, May 9.

Questions pertaining to enforcement actions and inspections should be directed to the Dallas Borough Zoning Enforcement Officer by calling the Dallas Borough Municipal Building at 675-1389.

Property owners should not fill containers with cinders in excess of 20 to 25 pounds as collection is made more difficult and heavy containers may not be picked up. Rocks, limbs and yard waste should not be included for pick-up with the street cinders and green recycling containers should not be placed curbside as the curbside yard waste recycling pick-up is not scheduled to begin until May.

Street sweeping program currently in progress

As the spring season approaches, the Dallas Borough Road Department will begin the annual Spring Street Sweeping Program. The program is expected to begin immediately, weather permitting, and will continue until all borough roads have been swept clean.

The road department requests that borough residents

follow a few simple instructions to assist in the collection of road cinders and winter materials deposited throughout the winter driving season.

Residents are asked to rake all cinders out to the side of the road in even layers, avoiding large piles. Under no circumstances should cinders be swept into the storm water catch basins.
