The Dallas Borough Codes Enforcement Office announces the seasonal enforcement of the Dallas Borough Property Maintenance Code.

Property owners should be alerted that inspections will be scheduled for all property owners deemed in violation of the code and the borough will prosecute all offenders through the enforcement of the regulations. Recent routine property inspections in neighborhoods throughout the borough revealed numerous violations, including exterior property violations for property owners failing to maintain their premises in a clean, safe and sanitary condition. The borough will require property owners to remove all vehicles not properly registered and inspected, inoperable motor vehicles, failure to cut grass, appliances littering yards, debris

> Residents are asked to rake all cinders out to the side of the road in even layers, avoiding large piles. Under no circumstances should cinders be swept into the storm water catch basins.

Property owners should not fill containers with cinders in excess of 20 to 25 pounds as collection is made more difficult and heavy containers may not be picked up. Rocks, limbs and yard waste should not be included for pick-up with the street cinders and green recycling containers should not be placed curbside as the curbside yard waste recycling pick-up is not scheduled to begin until May.


