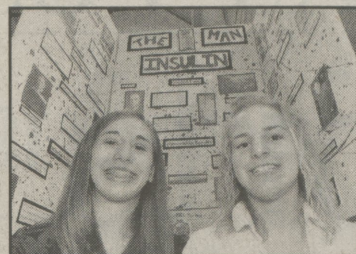




L-L students, from left, are Bryan Carter, Kristen Boyle and Marissa Moosic

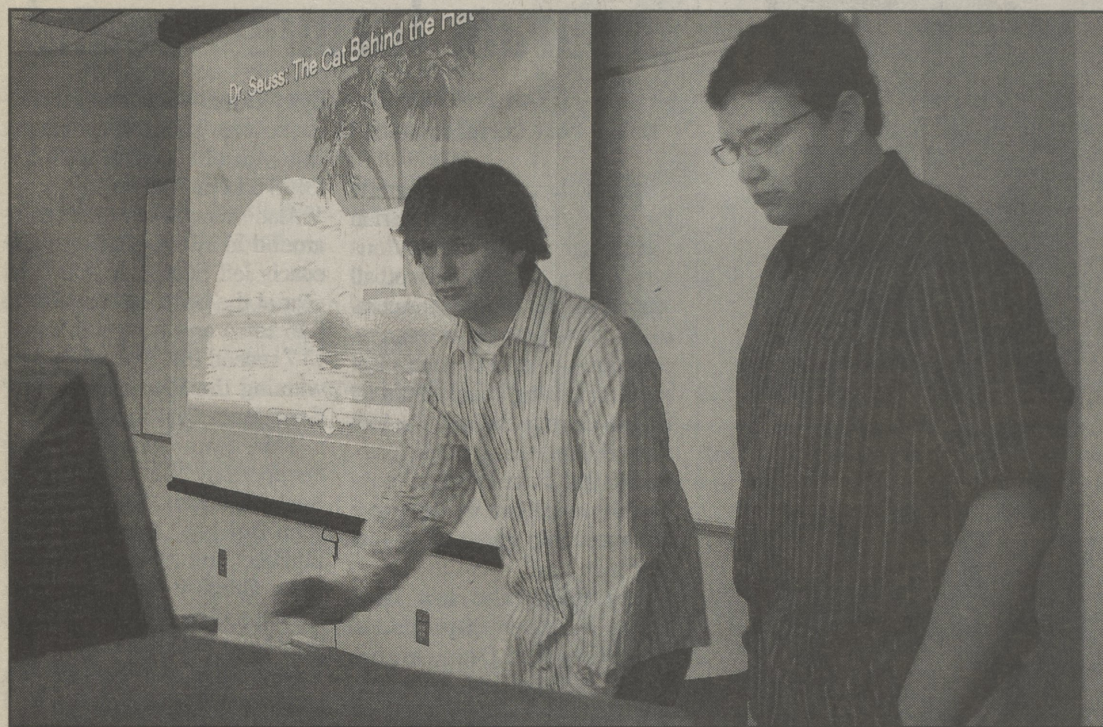

Over 500 students from northeastern Pennsylvania participated in the National History Day Regional Competition on Saturday, March 28, at Penn State Wilkes-Barre.

The students, in grades six through 12, chose historical topics related to a theme and conducted extensive primary and secondary research through libraries, archives, museums, oral history interviews and historic sites. Students then presented their work in original papers, Web sites, exhibits, performances and documentaries.
