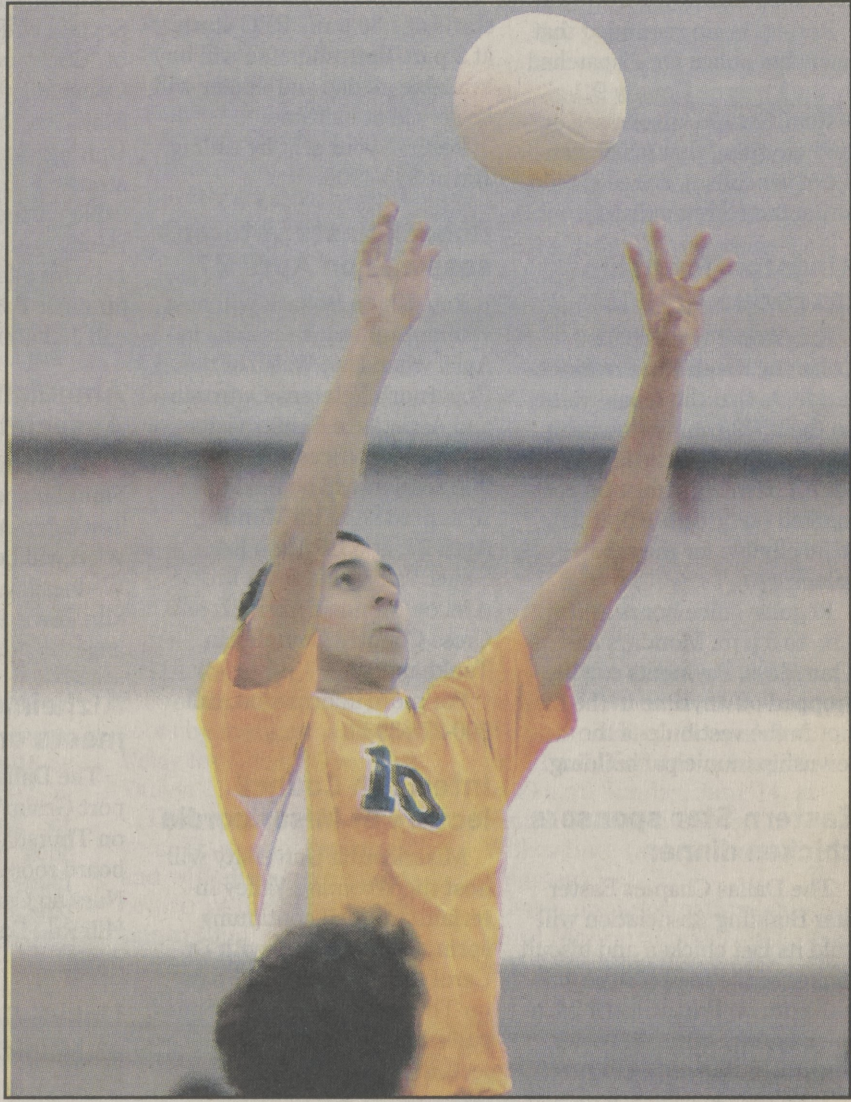
Keeper Becca Stull turned in a 10-save effort while Lake-Lehman had just one shot on goal.

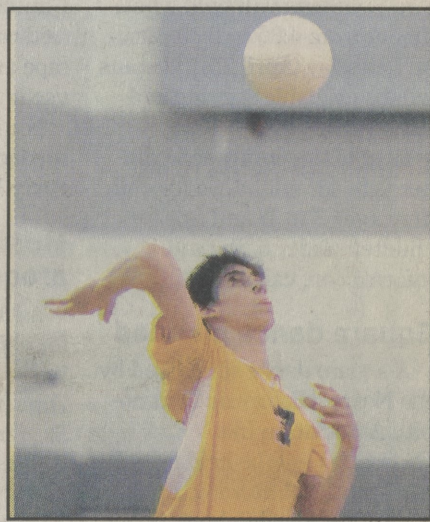

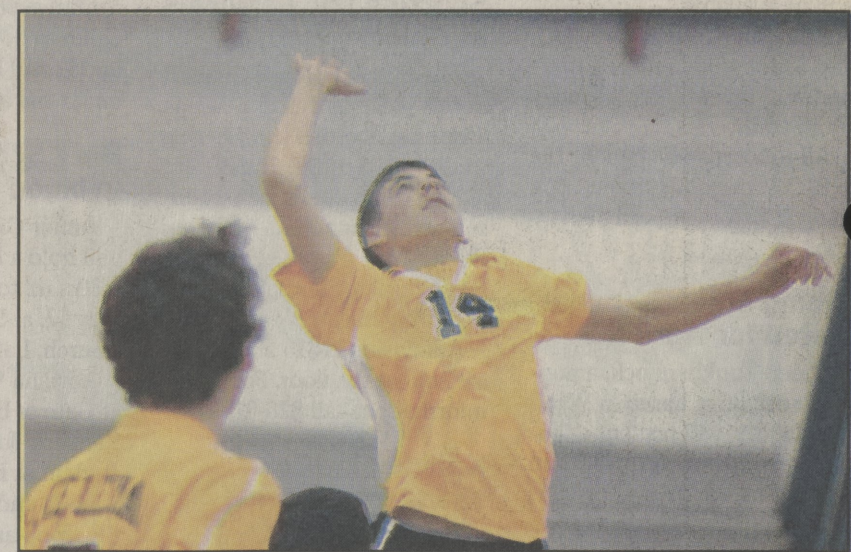
Zach Lofthouse prepares to return a volley from a Pittston Area player during a Tuesday afternoon game between the two Wyoming Valley Conference teams.
