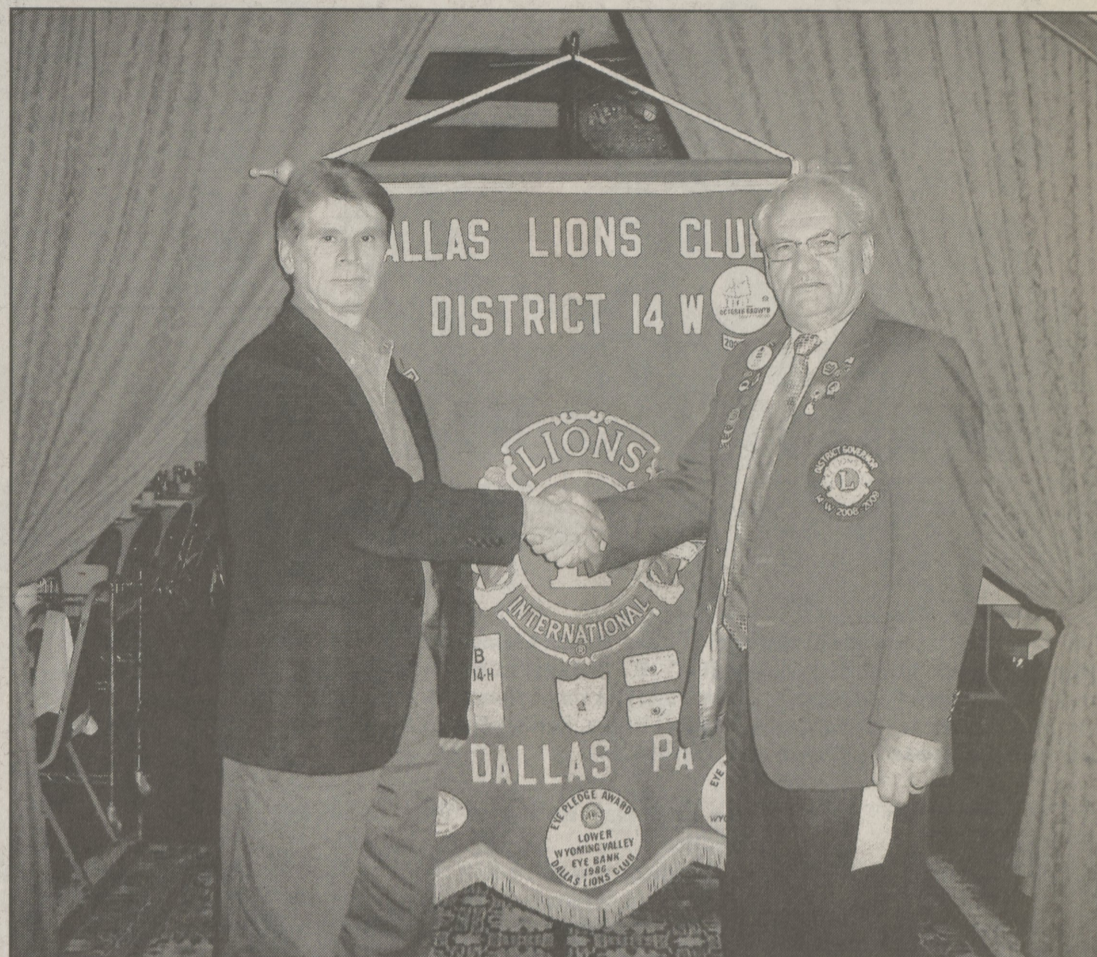


GOH FAMILIES DONATE TO ORPHANAGE IN AFGHANISTAN

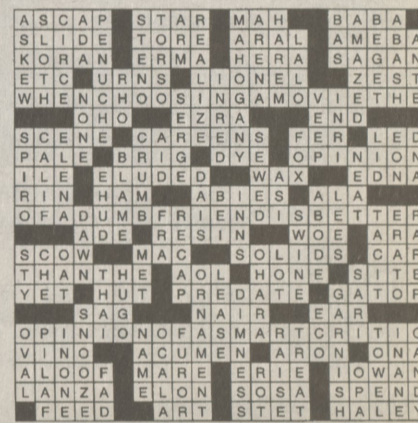
