The Back Mountain Bloomers Garden Club, in cooperation with National Garden Clubs Inc., strictly prohibits the exhibit of wild collected plants of endangered and threatened species.

The show is open to amateur gardeners and growers who, if entering the horticulture category, must have owned their own plant for 90 days.

Designers may use fresh or dried plant material in their designs, which need not have been grown

Entries will be accepted for judging between 8:30 and 10:30 a.m. on Friday, June 26.






DHS STUDENT DONATES PICNIC TABLE
