

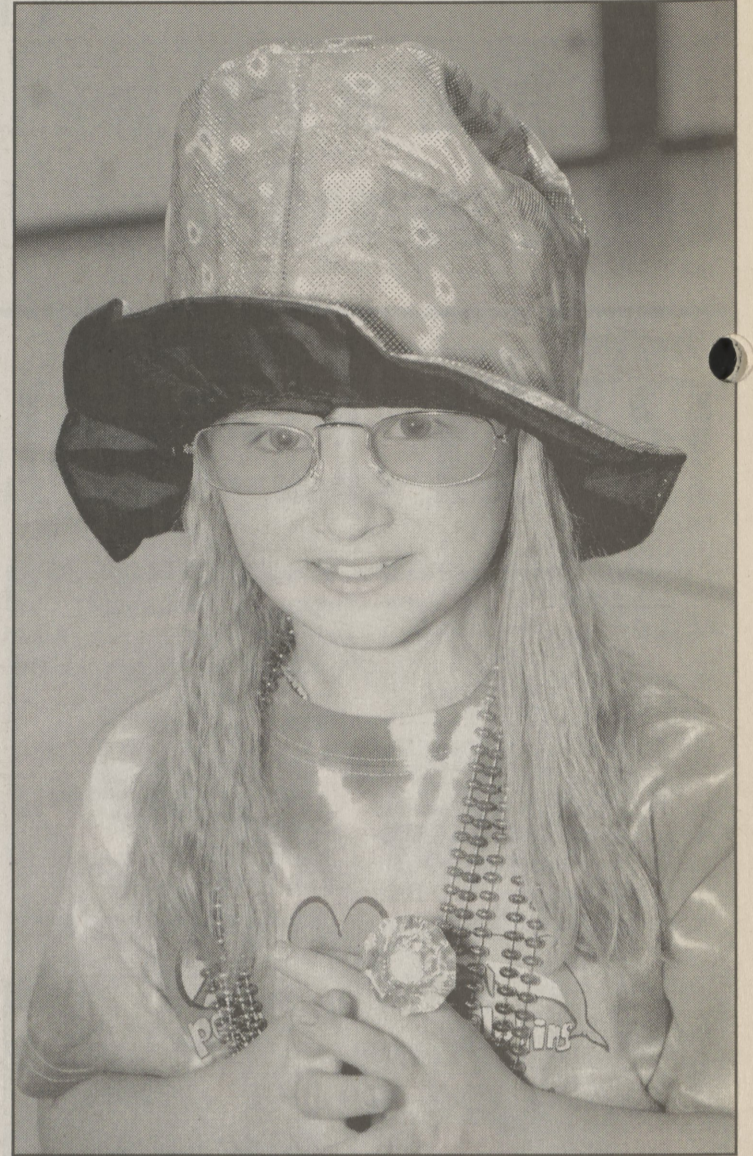
ADAMS WILL SWIM FOR BRIGHAM YOUNG

Soccer players of all abilities can learn at Penn State/WB camp

Penn State Wilkes-Barre will offer an action-packed week of soccer training for the beginner to the advanced player from June 22-26 featuring Penn State division I coaches and players from both the men's and women's teams.

Morning camp will take place from 9 a.m. to noon for children ages 6-13. Players will be grouped according to age, ability and experience.

Campers will have the opportunity to develop technical skills in dribbling, passing and shoot-

ing. Tactical elements such as decision making, attacking and defending principles will be covered through small-sided games.

The evening camp is structured to give the high school or club player, ages 14-18, a chance to improve his/her technical and tactical ability in practice and game situations. Participants will have the opportunity to be trained by college coaches and play alongside athletes from the men's and women's division I program.

The evening camp runs from

5:30 to 7:30 p.m. June 22-25.

Camp instructors Ryan Defibaugh and Trevor Gorman will lead the camp and follow the soccer curriculum of Penn State head coach and renowned clinician, Barry Gorman. Both coaches maintain a fun and relaxed atmosphere, while enhancing the skill levels of all the players.

Defibaugh, Penn State's assistant men's coach, has direct responsibility for the recruitment and instruction of the Penn State goalkeepers. He has coached nu-

merous summer camps and, in 2006, was a clinician at the Nike Joga Bonito tournament.

Gorman, a former Nittany Lions standout, is the assistant coach at Dartmouth College. He has coached various youth teams and soccer camps in Pennsylvania and holds several coaching diplomas from the National Soccer Coaches Association of America.

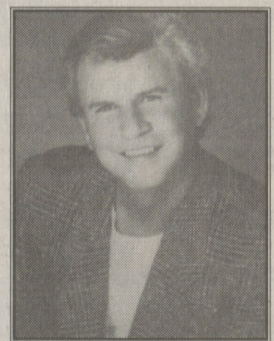

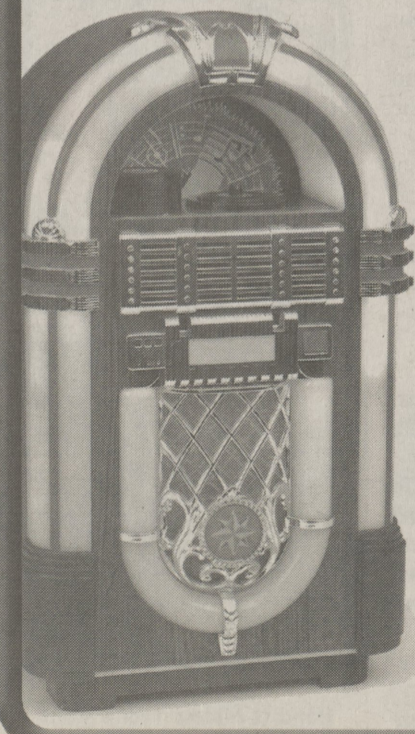
