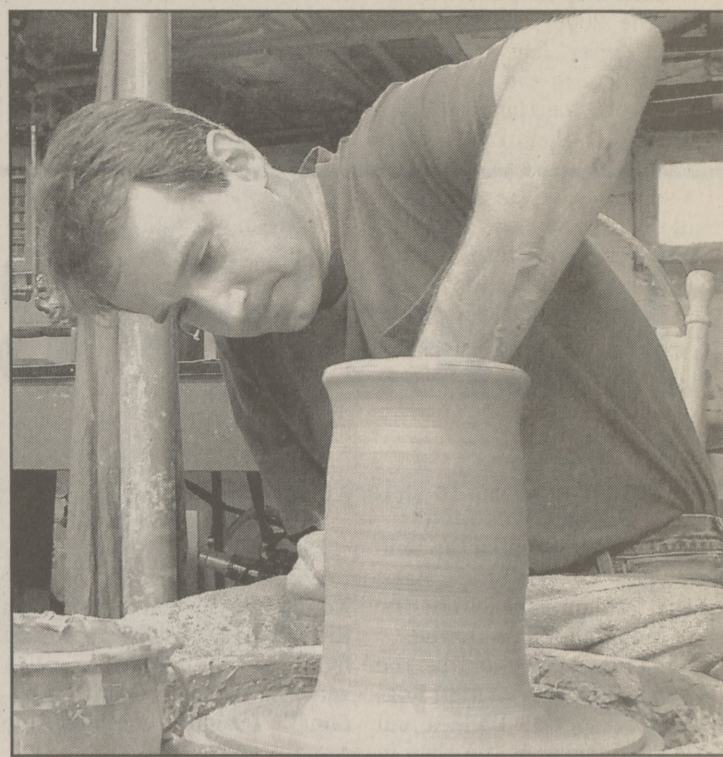
Sensbach, a local potter, will instruct the elementary age participants in the art of creating a bisque piece of pottery on July 14.
