Selenski named to **USA** team

Paige Selenski has been named to the USA Field Hockey 2009-2010 Women's Developmental Team.

Selenski, 19, of Shavertown, is a forward and mid-fielder on the field hockey team at the University of Virginia where she is entering her sophomore year. Selenski started every game and scored 19 goals last fall during her first college season and was also one of the top-scoring college field hockey players in the nation.

Selenski was also named the 2008 Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) Field Hockey Freshman of the Year. She is only the third player in the history of the University of Virginia to receive the prestigious ACC title.

The 2008 Dallas High School graduate was a member of the Lady Mountaineers field hockey team from seventh through 12th grades.

While a freshman at Dallas, Selenski was selected as a member of the USA Field Hockey Women's Under-16 Squad. She played in Holland twice on the U16
