summer recreation program at an hourly rate of \$7.25.

Carr noted in her manager's report that 89 children are registered for the program this year, with an average of 32 to 35 children attending every day. Carr said the average age of the children is 7 to 10 years old, which is younger than in previous years.

According to Carr, 175 children were registered for the program in 2008. This year's decline is because children from Dallas Township were turned away from the program.

Carr reported that she and Frank Wagner, a supervisor from the township, are looking at budget numbers from the past three years to come up with a proposal for a joint effort between the borough and the township for next year's summer recreation program.

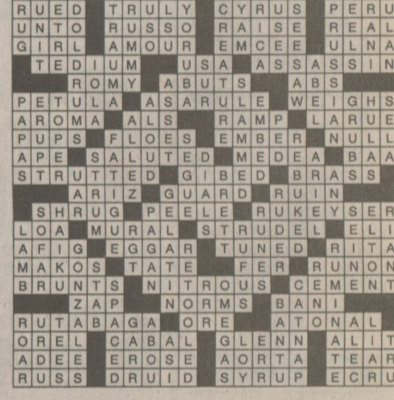
