The Back Mountain Bloomers Garden Club presented a check for \$10,000 to the Anthracite Scenic Trails Association (ASTA) as part of the formal opening of the new Trucksville Stairs portion of the Back Mountain Trail.

Judy Rimple, ASTA president, reported that the Tour of Back Mountain Gardens is one of the major fundraisers for AS-TA and is crucial to the creation of the Back Mountain Trail, a 10mile former railroad bed from Luzerne to Dallas being converted into a recreational trail for hiking and biking.

The check that was presented to Bill Leandri, chairman of the ASTA Board of Directors, by Lisa Lindquist of the Bloomer's Garden Tour committee, represented the proceeds for the 2009 Tour of Back Mountain Gardens. The 2009 tour was held Saturday, June 27, and attracted more than 400 visitors in addition to the nearly 75 Bloomers volunteers who helped staff the garden tour locations.

The bi-annual Garden Tour has grown in scope and profitability since its inception in 2003. The money raised previously was \$4,811 in 2003, \$3,331 in 2005 and \$5,384 in 2007. With the addition of the 2009 proceeds, the total comes to over \$23,000.

"I can't begin to thank the hard-working volunteers of the Back Mountain Bloomers Garden Club for their efforts," Rimple said. "Each tour takes more than a year of planning and the committee works tirelessly to make sure that visitors have a wonderful and enlightening time. 
