


Campers at Camp Orchard Hill in Dallas relax in between activities.

Many of the camp counselors attended the day camp or resident camp as children. Camp




METS WIN AAA CHAMPIONSHIP

Monday, Aug. 10, 9 a.m. -Senior high boys


Thursday, Aug. 13, 9 a.m. -Junior high girls
