

Two are named Misericordia trustees

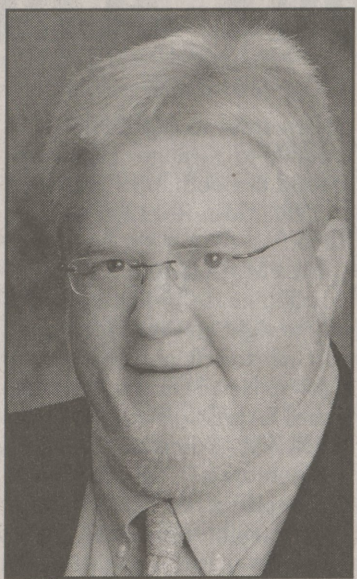
Harold E. "Hal" Flack II, of Dallas, and Scott Lynett, of Shavertown, have been named to the Board of Trustees at Misericordia University.

They will begin their three-year terms in October.

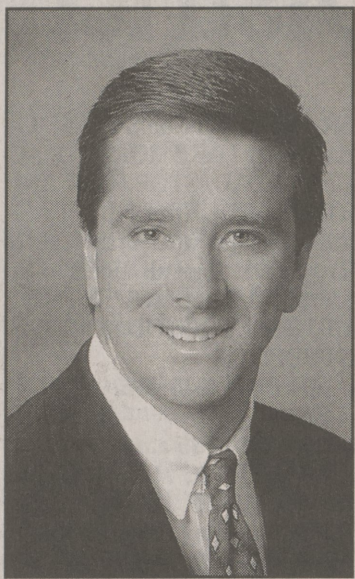
