

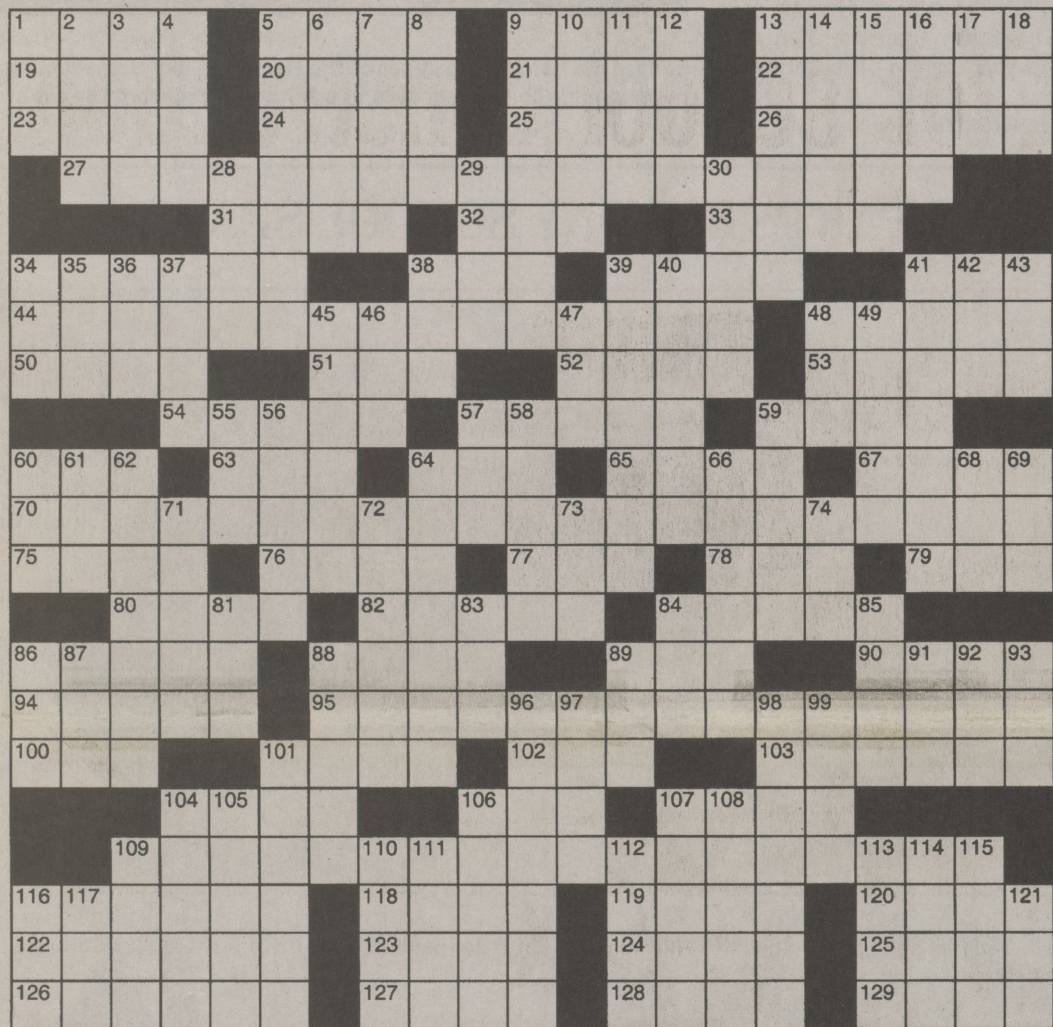

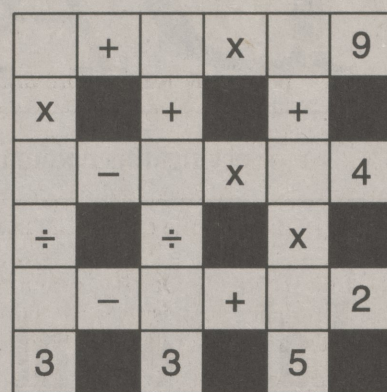

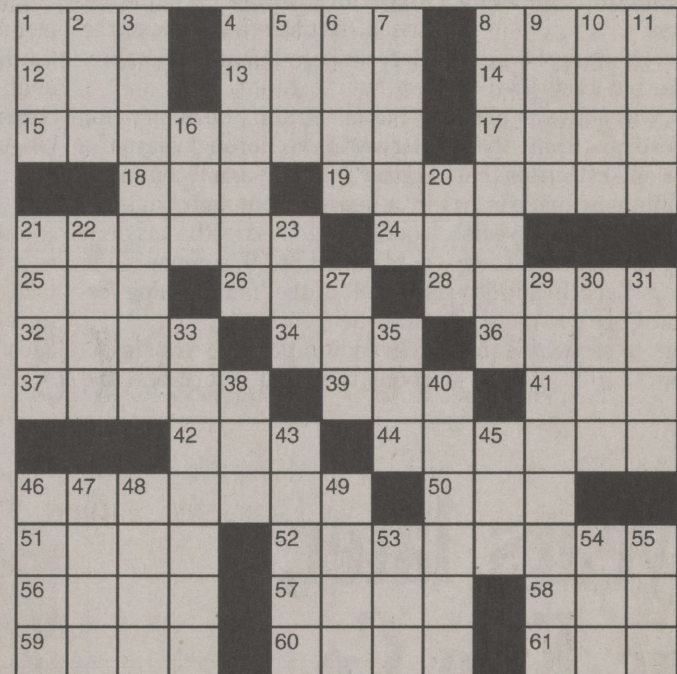

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ROSS TOWNSHIP

Two road construction projects bids awarded; renovations updated

Two road construction project bids were awarded while updates on renovation at the Ross Township Park and road bonding were announced at Tuesday night's supervisors' meeting.

Supervisors were given the green light to accept bids for a mile and a half of resurfacing and work to two road shoulders on Niemchik Road. The work will be paid out of \$280,000 the township has received from the feder-

ally funded Community Development Grant program.

Chairman Stanford Davis said five sealed bids were received. They were HRI Construction, Bloomsburg, \$235,974; Popple Construction, Laflin, \$220,818; Slusser Brothers, Pittston, \$218,884.70; American Asphalt, Shavertown, \$217,338; and Pikes Creek, Sweet Valley, \$198,246.40.

Bids for the second project for 1,000 feet of paving repairs on Skurat Road were opened.

Bids received were from: HRI,

Bloomsburg, \$39,858; America Asphalt, Shavertown, \$35,822.50; Slusser Brothers, Pittston, \$34,710; Popple Construction, Laflin, \$31,372.50; and Pikes Creek, Sweet Valley, \$30,927.50.

Supervisors awarded both bids to Pikes Creek, pending filing of appropriate paperwork.

Updates on the repairs to the township's park were provided by Supervisor David Williams who reported the repairs to the basketball and tennis courts are almost complete. The surfaces

of the basketball and tennis courts are finished and fencing will be installed by the end of the week.

Williams said once the fencing is completed a three-inch drop between the surface of the basketball court and grass will be filled in and leveled.

The township will bond its roads for weight limits and supervisors are working with Municipal Solutions of Linden, PA. Davis said changes have been made to the Municipal Solution's report and resub-

mitted.

By taking steps to bond township roads for weight limits, the township will protect itself from paying to repair road damage caused by heavy trucks.

In other news, supervisors announced two upcoming free used tire recycling events sponsored by the Luzerne County Commissioners, the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection

Road closing noted

The Jackson Township, Plymouth Township and Larksville Borough Road and Street Departments will work together to repair and resurface Weavertown Road from the intersection of Huntsville Road in Jackson Township to the area of the UGI power substation on Mountain Road in Plymouth Township.

Work will begin on Tuesday, Sept. 8, and will continue from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily, weather permitting. Road closings will be in effect and local motorists should expect delays.

Emergency vehicles and school buses will not be affected by the closing and will be allowed through the work area.
