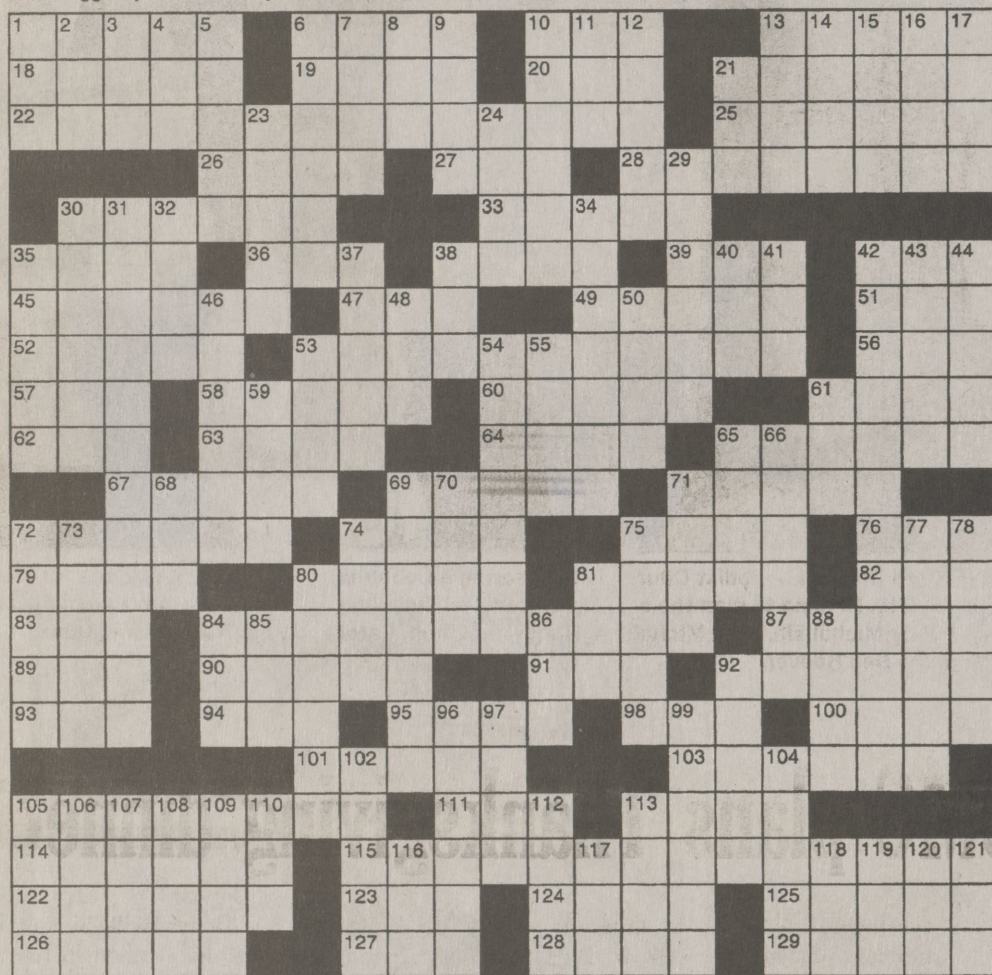

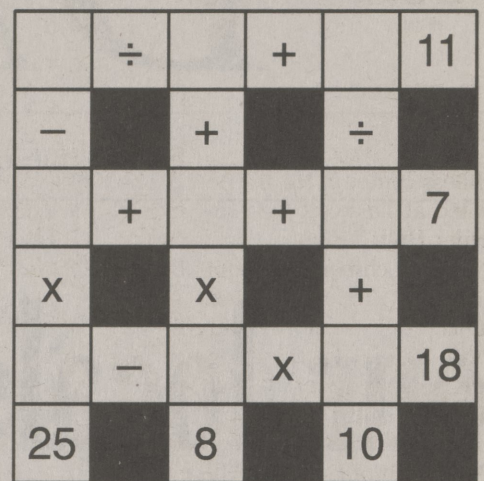

 If you answer "yes" to any of the above, call now for a free screening and/or evaluation.
 Your child, ages birth through 2 years old, may be eligible for free early intervention services.
 Children do not need a diagnosis of mental retardation to qualify for Early Intervention Services.
 All children determined eligible receive free and appropriate services, regardless of families' assets or income.
 No insurance is necessary and all information is confidential.
 Phone the Early Intervention Services Unit of the Luzerne-Wyoming Counties Mental Health/Mental Retardation Program at 826-3030.
