Portions will be extra large because the cafeteria director has purchased seventy-five pounds of turkey more than used last year.

1939 - 70 YEARS AGO

The purchase of more than 18,000 bushels of apples in Northeastern Pennsylvania recently by the Federal Surplus Commodities Corp. has made a considerable dent in this regions staggering apple surplus, the result of the second bumper crop in three years.

Twelve carloads of apples - averaging about 500 bushels to the car - have been bought from Altar and Rosary Society of farmers in the Dallas section alone, according to Harold Brace of Orange, who is directing the whittling down of the surplus in seven counties.

This year's crop in Luzerne County has been estimated as high as 2,500,000 bushels, which would mean that it exceeds even the bumper crop of 1937. The natural, two-year cycle, added to the fact that a freeze in 1938 killed blossoms and resulted in a short crop last year, is given as an explanation for this year's sur-
