Resident offers tax-saving suggestion to supervisors

Resident John Newman presented supervisors Tuesday evening with a written suggestion to lower municipal taxes in the 2010 budget.

Newman said he looked at the proposed budget and saw that \$900,000 in surplus money will be carried over from 2009.

He requested the supervisors lower the tax rate from .52 mills to .197 mills as a result. A mill is a \$1 tax for every \$1,000 in as-
