Dallas student wins at engineering forum

A student from Dallas was part of a team of students from Northeastern University that took top honors at the national Chem-E-Car competition at the American Institute of Chemical Engineers (AIChE) national conference held last month in Nashville. Matched up against 30 teams from colleges across the country, 10 Northeastern students, including Patrick McMahon from Dallas, earned the first place prize of \$2,000, as well as the judges' accolades. McMahon graduated from Lake-Lehman High School in '05 and is the team captain. The team's car, "The Aluminator," took nearly a year to build and was powered by an environmentally clean hydrogen fuel cell. The students' challenge was to design a car that would be both powered and controlled by chemical reactions.
