
**STEFANOWICZ** - Elizabeth, of

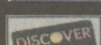
