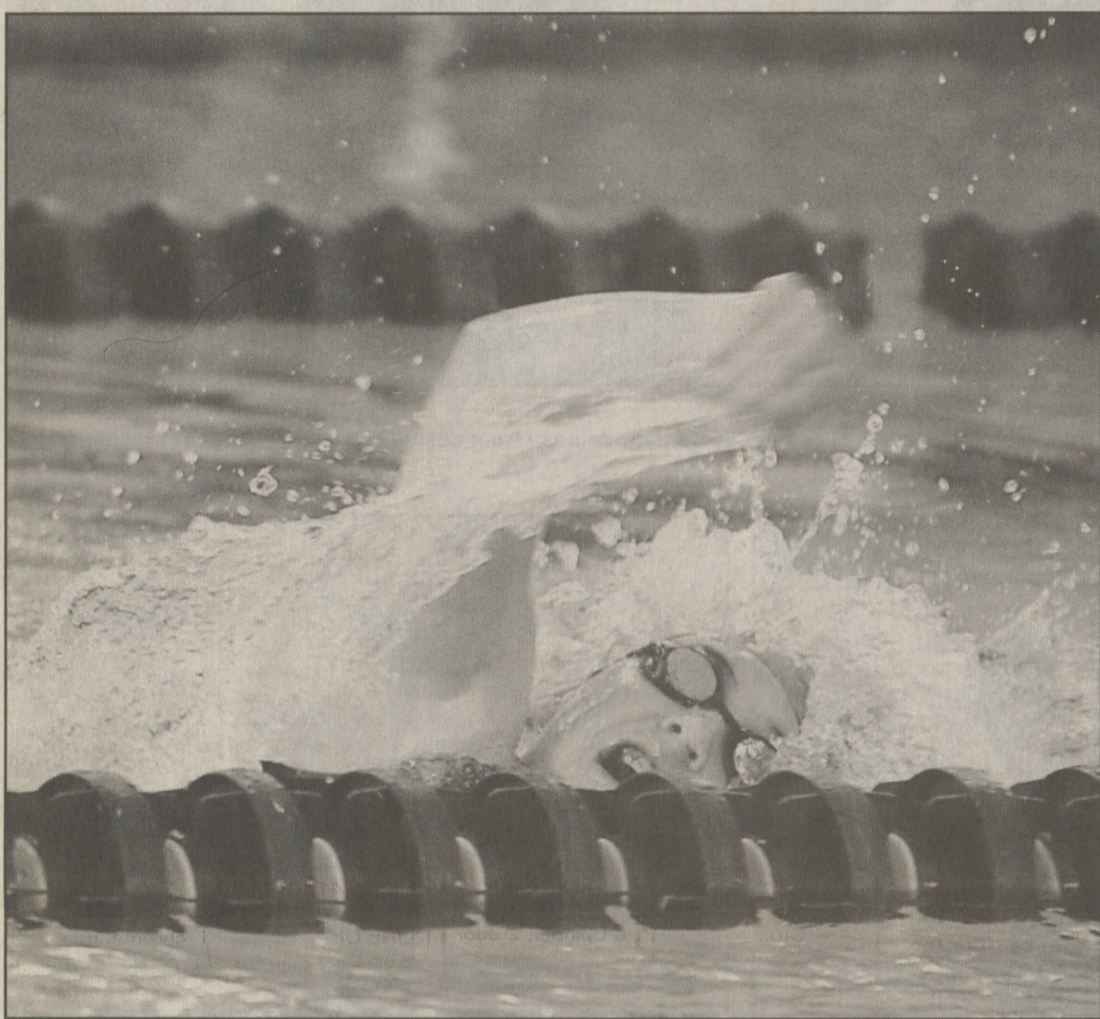

Dalton Simpson led the Hornets with 19 points in the loss while Michael Luksic added six. Brian Kmetz and John Macey also scored for the Hornets.

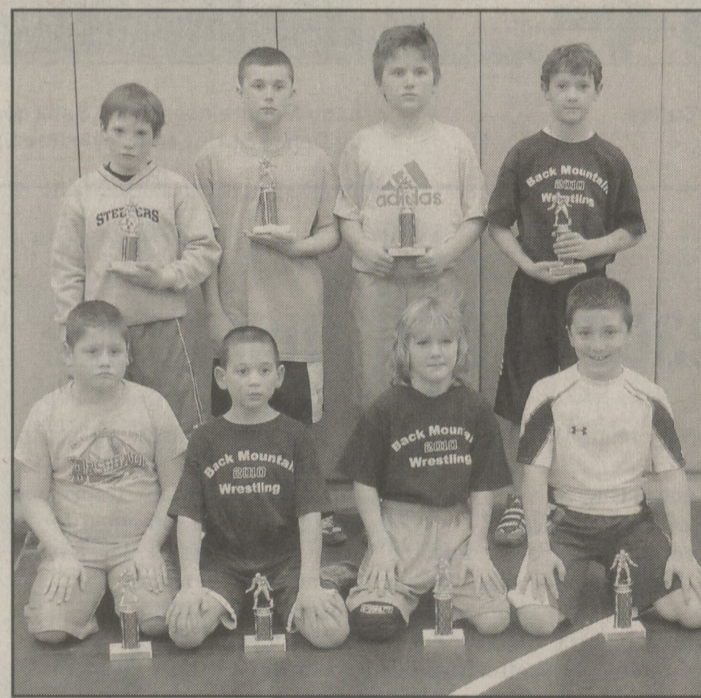
THIRD GRADE SKILLS COMPETITION
