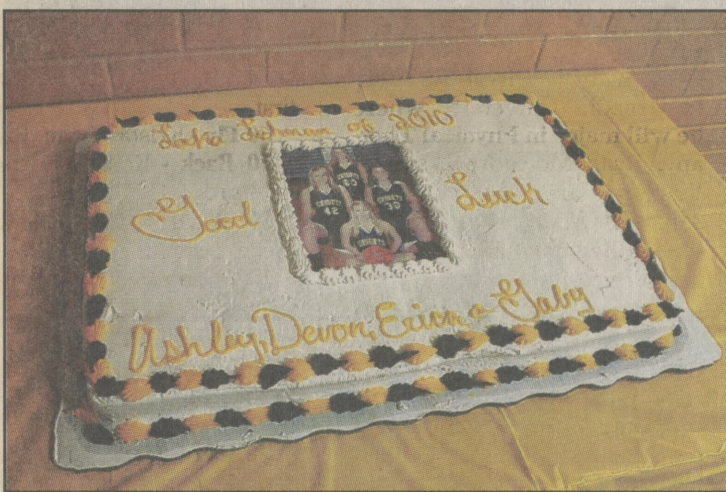

Grossman, of Shavertown, will attend Brown University in Providence, Rhode Island in the fall.

A three-year varsity letter winner and starter at forward for the Blue Knights, Grossman was a member of the 2008 state championship team. She was named to the Academic All-State Team in 2009 and has participated in Futures, the National Festival and the Pocono and KaPow indoor field hockey teams. She helped lead the Blue Knights to a 23-1 record in 2008 and a 20-1 record in 2009.

Grossman is a four-sport athlete, earning varsity letters in field hockey, lacrosse, soccer and diving.

She is the daughter of Dr. and Mrs. Loren Grossman of Shavertown.
