Lehman girls battle to state game

he Lake-Lehman girls' basketball punched a ticket to the state championship tournament on March 5 with a 45-29 win over division foe Meyers at Wyoming Valley West High School in the District 2 Class 2A consolation game.

After a sluggish and turnoverladen start for both Meyers and Lehman, it looked as if Meyers was hitting its stride early in the second quarter.

The Mohawks ended the first and started the second quarter with baskets that cut Lehman's lead to one point and had the Knights' top scorer, Selena Adamshick, in check with physical defense.

On more than one occasion, Adamshick found herself on the floor after a hard pick or a wayward elbow. However, the Knights refused to get rattled.

After Jessica Neare and Adamshick traded baskets on four straight trips down the court, Lake-Lehman stretched its lead to nine. Gabby Olsehmski was fouled on a three-point attempt with 1.1 seconds to go and easily converted all three free throws for a commanding 20-8 lead at the half. Neare stepped up after Meyers' run to score on back-toback trips down the court to slow the rally. A pair of free-throws from Niki Sutliff and an Adamshick three-pointer quelled it completely and sent Lehman into the fourth quarter with a 29-17

The Mohawks came out in the final stanza taking their shots to get back in the game, but it just wasn't enough offense as the Knights iced the game from the free throw line as the quarter
