

Consumers can apply for and receive rebates by following three simple steps:

• Reserve a rebate by completing an online application (available at www.paheatingrebates.com on April 21). Residents without Internet access can call 877-592-2061 to make a reservation;

• Purchase and have a contractor install a qualifying product. Purchases made before April 21 will not be eligible;

· Submit the completed rebate application within 30 days of the reservation date.

The best way to guarantee a rebate is to obtain a reservation when in the process of deciding to make a purchase.

Rebates will range from \$100 to \$500, depending on the equipment's efficiency rating.
