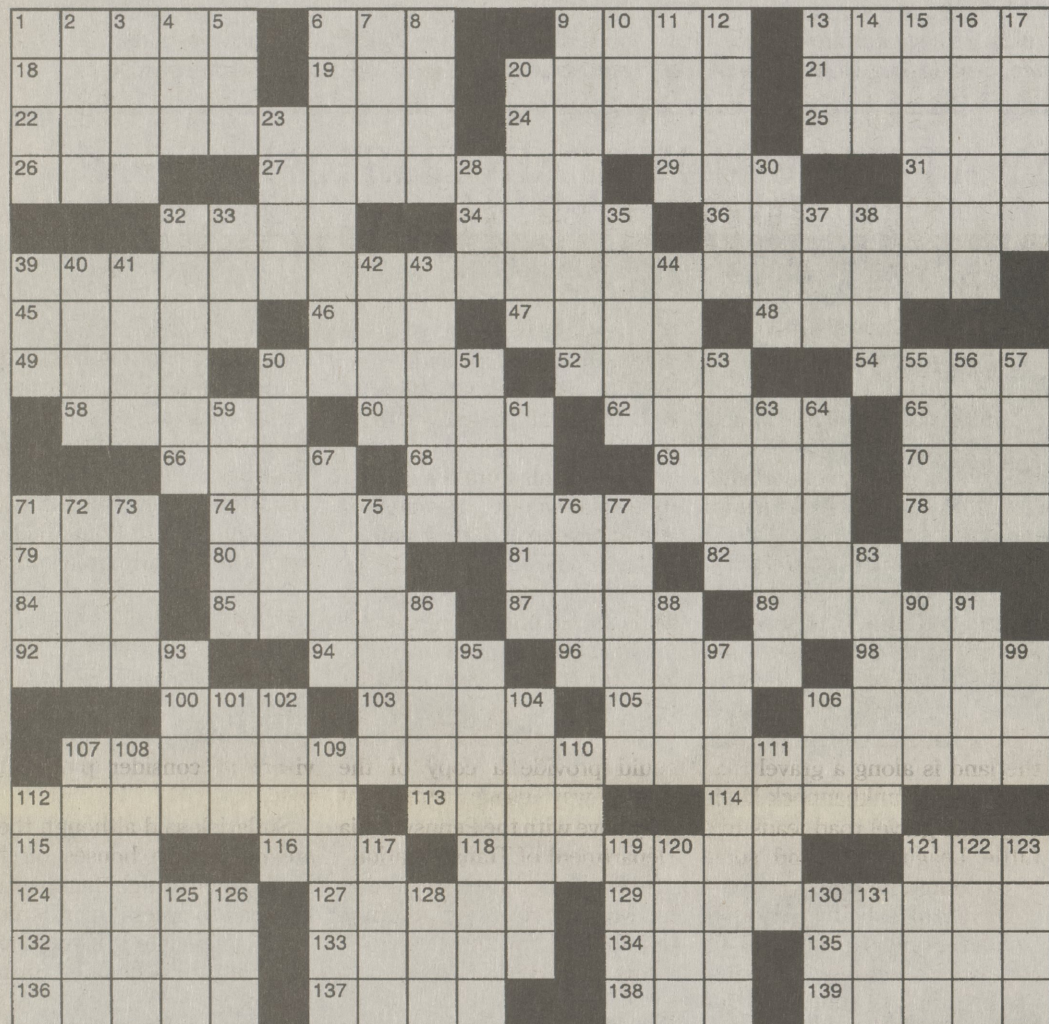

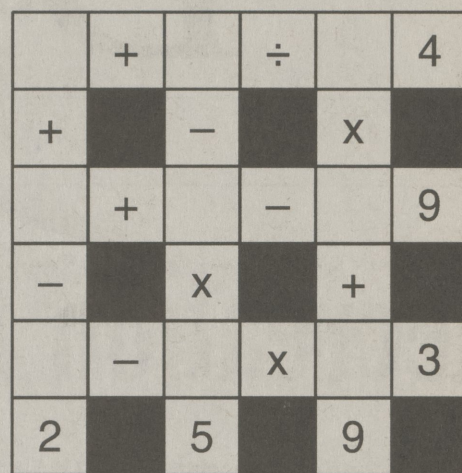

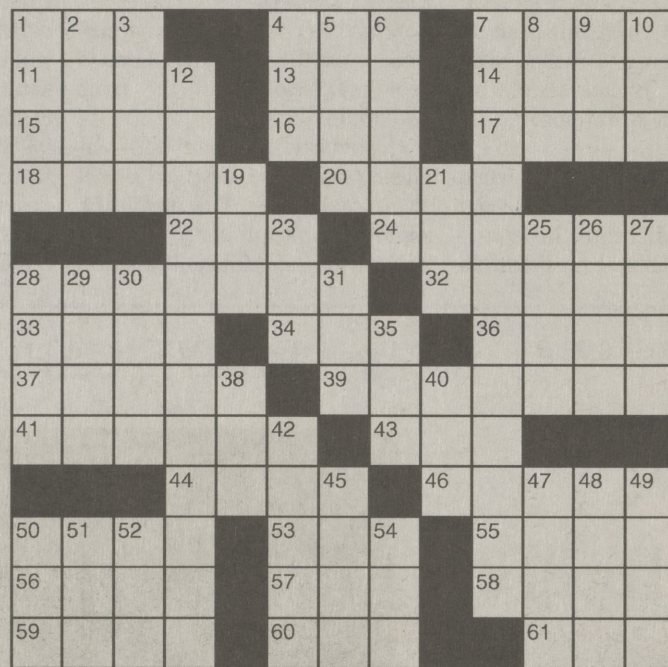

Seniors citizens can get vouchers for markets and stands

Rep. Karen Boback (R-Columbia/Luzerne/Wyoming) encourages eligible senior citizens who live in Luzerne and Wyoming counties to sign up to receive vouchers worth \$20 from the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture at participating farmers' markets and roadside stands.

The program, known as the Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Program (SFMNP), was established to promote the consumption of fresh, nutritious, locally-grown fruits and vegetables.

Participants in the program will receive four \$5 SFMNP vouchers to redeem at qualified farmers' markets or roadside stands.

The vouchers can be used toward fresh fruits, vegetables and herbs but cannot be used on processed foods such as jams, honey, nuts, cider or baked goods. Some citrus and tropical fruits are also exempt.

To qualify, individuals must be age 60 or older by Dec. 31, 2010 and have a total household income, before taxes, of less than \$20,036 for a single person and \$26,955 for a couple. Income limits are subject to change and are based on federal guidelines in place on June 22.

Vouchers will be distributed on a first-come, first-served basis to eligible senior citizens who have not already received them from

10 a.m. to noon on Tuesday, June 22, at the Sweet Valley Church of Christ at 5439 Main Rd., Sweet Valley.
