Trailing 4-0, the Phillies started the sixth inning with a walk by Chad Phillips. Next, Jeremy Jayne ripped his second single of the game and Lee Eckert followed with a walk to load the bases, setting the stage for Mingey's big home run.

Eckert struck out six Orioles in 5 1/3 innings before Jeremy Jayne earned the win in relief.

The Orioles' David Simpson had three RBI, including a two-run home and a double. Charles Giacometti delivered an RBI single.

Matt Moleski pitched excellent, striking out eight Phillies before getting to the 85 pitch limit in the sixth inning.
