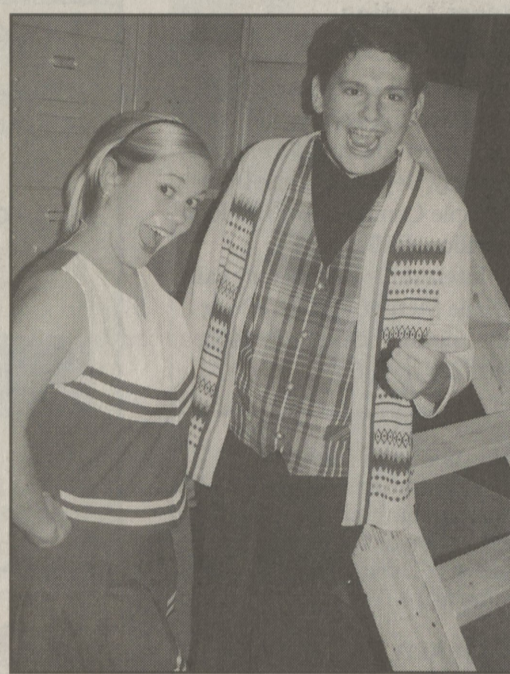

Local students appear in 'Grease'

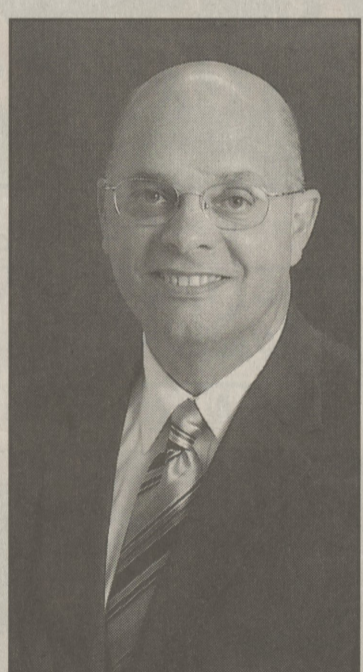

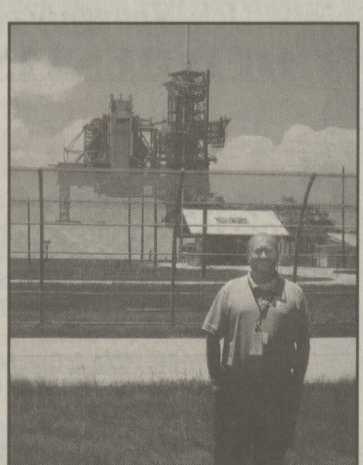
