

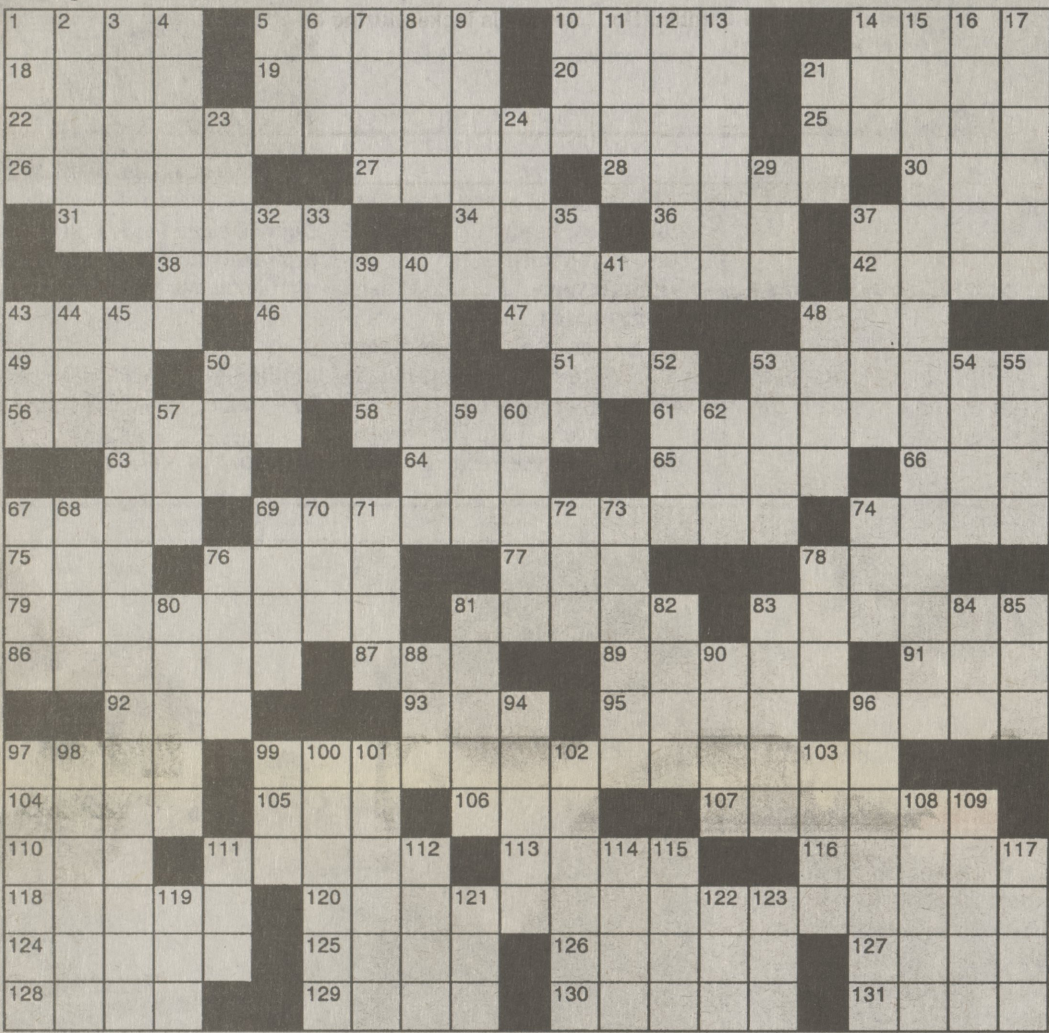

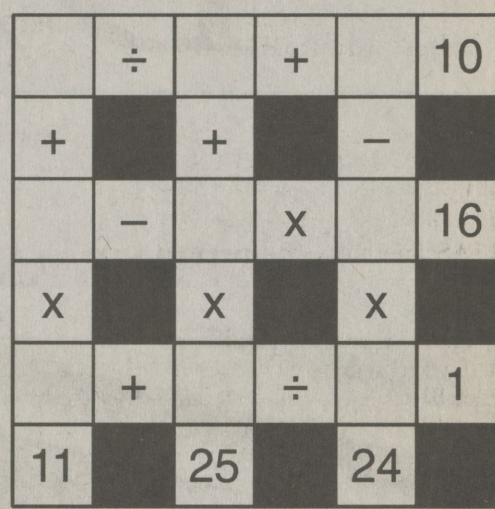

Dr. Chas McBrien also graduated from The Ohio State University College of Veterinary

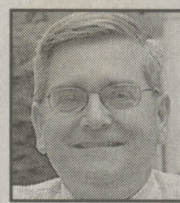
Medicine where he was awarded Excellence in Small Animal Surgery and Excellence and Clinical Proficiency in Small Animal Internal Medicine by the faculty.
