Holdredge and Andrew Grabowski.

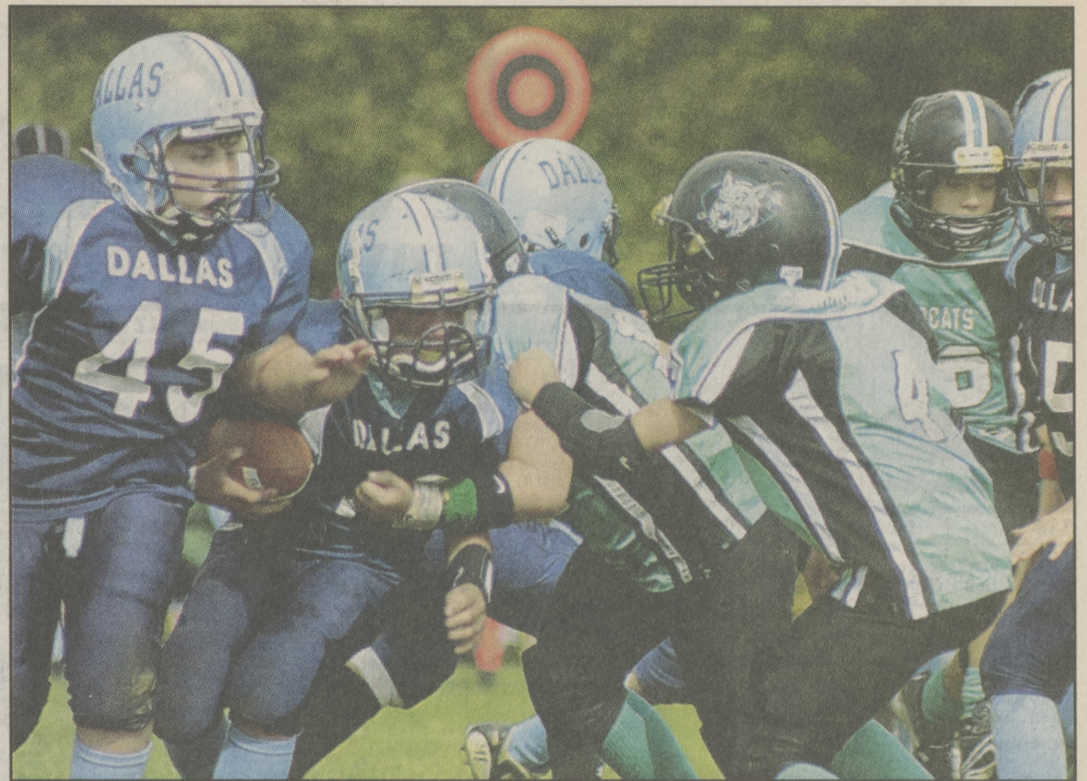
KT converted the extra point on a pass from Devin Roberts to David Schuster.
