### Tire program registration set

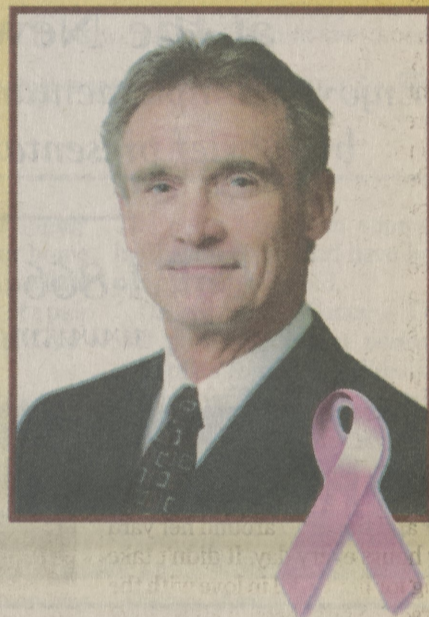
