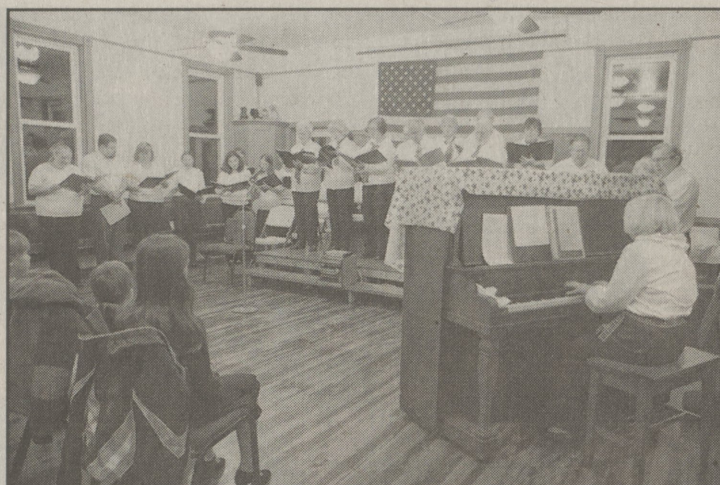
He was active with the Red Cross Blood Services, Interfaith Flood Recovery, the Metropolitan Lutheran Council and the Council of Churches.
