Campus Ministry's "Adopt A program provided Thanksgiving food for 101 area families. Approximately 2,000 food items were collected, totaling more than \$6,000. Because of an increased need this year, the number of bagged items collected exceeded 2009's total by 30.

"The response from the campus, as well as the community, has been overwhelming," said project coordinator Kristen Mitchell Samuels, community outreach coordinator for Misericordia University. "We started this project two years ago and proudly fed 32 families for more than 70 last year. The spirit

The food was presented in reusable grocery bags to encourage recycling.


