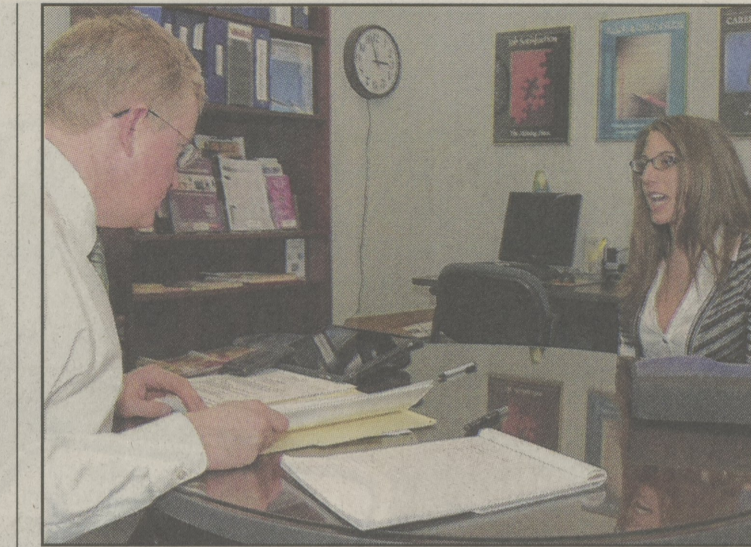
Students must achieve a grade point average of 3.5 or above, a B or greater in all their classes and complete at least 15 credits to earn dean's list status for a semester.

Students learn from mock interviews

Misericordia University students took another important step toward their future careers with a series of mock interviews with regional business professionals at the Insalaco Center for Career Development (ICCD).

Forty-five Misericordia juniors and seniors dressed in professional attire brought their newly-refined resumes and interview skills to the practice sessions. Representatives from regional employers, including Julia Edmunds Associates, Riverside Rehabilitation, The Times Leader, The Metz Group, The Commonwealth Medical College and Mercy Health Partners

took part in the process.

Misericordia senior Kari Leigh Breazeale, of Dallas, said she hoped the session would help her gain a sense of confidence and comfort when a job offer is on the line. Her mock interview with Joe Butkiewicz, vice president and executive editor of The Times Leader, did just that.

"Prior to the mock interview session, I attended a workshop that the Insalaco Center offered about interviewing and practiced answering the sample questions they provided," said the senior communications major who hopes to secure a position in journalism or broad-

casting. "I thought the mock interview was very beneficial - the interviewer gave me quick tips at the end and it helped me to realize the general feel of an interview. Overall, I think with more practice, my interviews will be very successful."

The mock interviews are only one of several workshops held by ICCD each semester to help students prepare for their future job placement. The center also holds workshops on resume preparation, business and dining etiquette, preparing for an internship, financial fitness (credit, budget and paycheck basics) and diversity in the workplace.
